


Growing in the knowledge and love of God

Matthew 28:18-20




Just before Jesus left the disciples and ascended into heaven he gave the command to baptise people and teach them all about their saviour Jesus. Learning the faith has always been a fundamental role of the Church because it's hard to be in a relationship and exchange love if we don't really know someone. We have just started a playgroup that caters for the very young and parents. CCs brings primary school children together for fun and sharing the faith. Kids at Heart is a quality program on Sunday mornings for children. Our youth program is more challenging as our teenagers gather for bible study fortnightly so that **God speaks to them** at this critical age. Jesse Hahn has just initiated a young adults group that, once again, provides support and growth in God's word. And a group of ladies have just begun an evening Bible study. Shortly all members will receive a survey, the results of which will shape our education programs for the wider congregation. At Salt Factory, the first Sunday is dedicated to exploring our spiritual gifts and exercising them in a real ministry context. It is wonderful to see so many of our members **step out in faith and grow as agents of God's grace.**

I am very excited by what God is doing through these educational ministries. If you have any ideas or you feel God is placing something on your heart for us as a community, please let Ruth or me know. **Together we can obey Jesus' command and draw closer to our Lord.**



From the Editor




1. Bible Song: A Christian education program that is designed for children ages 3-10 to participate in during Sunday worship 9:30am. Sharing The Christian Faith With Others

Our Christian faith and the application of this is very important at the school and this can be seen in many different ways. The first word of our vision statement is **BELIEVE**. This word has a double meaning with the first meaning highlighting our faith. We state that the Christian faith, from a Lutheran understanding is an important element in the school and is practised through our worship life and Christian Studies lessons.



Worship: The staff begin each morning with devotion time. This is led by different teachers each week and sets the tone for the day. Classes also begin their day with a devotion time - a reminder that Jesus is with us as we go through the day. The week culminates with our awesome weekly school worship service held on Fridays. The students get quite involved with this - especially when the staff band play. One of the highlights of our worship is the practice of Holy Communion. This is held twice a term and we are one of few schools in Australia which celebrate this in the primary setting.



Christian Studies: We follow the curriculum written by Lutheran Education Australia. Lessons are planned and taught throughout the year under four headings: **Christian Beliefs**, the **Christian Church**, **Christian Living** (eg. students investigate how God motivates, equips and uses Christians to serve others) and **Christianity in the World** (eg. God helps people by the work of the Holy Spirit). It is a great privilege to be able to share and teach the Christian faith to the school community.

Pastor Greg is a terrific resource leading worship, being a member on our spiritual life team and working in classrooms (especially running Step up to Communion). May God continue to bless our work. Shane Paterson



Called to Serve

I can clearly remember as a child that I aspired to be teacher when 'I grew up'! My childhood home was in the seaside suburb of Altona in Victoria and I attended Luther College in Melbourne for the last 5 years of my secondary schooling. In my last year at Luther, I was part of a contingent of students who travelled by bus to South Australia to visit what was then known as Luther Seminary and Lutheran Teachers College. The bus journey began in Queensland and worked its way down the eastern coast to pick up students who were interested in serving in the church as a pastor or a teacher. After this trip, I felt that **God was calling me to serve** in the Lutheran education system and decided to come to South Australia to do my teacher training. This was a huge step in faith for me as my family were in Melbourne and I had never travelled further than Horsham. One of my favourite Bible verses is, **'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future'. Jeremiah 29:11.** Little did I realise at that time that I would be involved in Lutheran Education for 34 years and that I would also discover the importance of **trusting God** as His plans for my life were very different to what I thought they should be.

During my years of teaching, I have had the privilege of working at Concordia Primary School in Toowoomba, Qld, Immanuel Primary school, Novar Gardens and Golden Grove Lutheran Primary. At these schools, I served in various roles including classroom teacher, teacher-librarian and deputy principal. During this time, I was also seconded to work at the Association of Independent Schools of South Australia (AISSA) as a Literacy Advisor and as a Christian Studies Facilitator for the Lutheran Schools Association of SA, NT and WA when *LIFE: a curriculum for Christian Studies* was first introduced into Australian Lutheran schools. My last years of service were at Australian Lutheran College as a 'Lecturer in Education/ Associate Dean for Learning and Teaching', working alongside students who were training to be teachers or pastors from 2009 until my retirement in 2016.

In 1994, I was introduced to Ian (Zimmo) by a mutual friend and we were married at Glandore Lutheran Church

in 1995. Our marriage is a **real blessing from God** as we both thought at the time that part of God's plan was for each of us to remain single. During our 22 years, we have encountered several challenges that have helped us to see that **God is fulfilling his plans for us and that we need to continue to place our trust in him.** The greatest challenge that we have faced as a couple was not being able to have children. This was a real struggle for us. It is often something that you assume will naturally happen and then you realise that this isn't something that you can control. You feel that you have failed in some way along with letting your partner down. It is difficult to let go of that dream, as a lot of daily happening and events in life are focused on families. We are fortunate that Ian's brother and his wife have made us a strong part of their children's lives. Special blessings from God! Over the last couple of years both of us have faced crucial health issues. **We are thankful that our God who is constant, continually provides great support for us** through knowledgeable health care professionals along with wonderful friends and family.

Christian Education Team

This year I have taken on the role of Chairperson for the Christian Education Team. The CET is a new addition to GGLC in 2017. It is responsible for ensuring that the Christian education needs of the Congregational members are being delivered by the various ministries of the Church. In examining the current ministries, it was acknowledged that GGLC has deliberately focussed on and strategically developed several strong programs to support the children and youth ministries in the congregation and that this will continue and be monitored in the future. The team recognises that Christian Education is lifelong and that while the children and youth ministries are a current focus, planning for other age groups and their needs in the congregation would be the next logical step. It was resolved that a survey be developed to establish the needs of the congregation and the resulting information be used to identify and inform which programs, courses, bible studies etc. would best support and 'feed' members of GGLC. The survey is currently being developed and will be distributed sometime in the coming months. I would encourage you to respond to the survey to assist the CET in planning and establishing meaningful programs that will support you to 'grow in Christ'.

Highlights from Church Council



Jon Schutz & Denise Kloeden -Church Council @ Church AGM

- GGLC hosted the One-day **Synod** of the LCA SA/NT District on May 20. Thank you to everyone who helped make the day happen – cleaning up inside and outside, the special audio-visual arrangements, set-up the night before, baking for morning tea, car parking, serving morning tea and lunch, running the A-V, and tidying up afterwards. The day ran very smoothly and we received many kind comments from the District staff and attendees on the facilities and arrangements.
- We are privileged to be the recipients of the \$25,000 **Mission Stimulus Grant** which is provided annually by the LLL and facilitated by the District. In a slightly awkward moment, the Grant was awarded to us at the One-day Synod (which we hosted) by Allen Kupke from the LLL (also one of our members). Nevertheless it was awarded on merit as the District Department for Mission recognised the mission value in our proposed **renovations** to make the front of our church an open-door hub of activity.
- Café, Office, Deck and Amenities – is a concise summary of the scope of the renovations and the detail can be found in the video presentation on Facebook (shortcut <http://bit.ly/gglcreno>). Now Church Council will look to finalise costings and apply for a loan, as approved by the Congregation at the AGM, so the work can proceed.
- The Congregation also approved a new **Constitution** at the AGM. This has now been sent to the District for final sign-off, at which point it will officially come into effect.
- The construction of our celebration and thanksgiving **altar** and other sanctuary furniture is well under way, being handled by Chris Hampel at Tea Tree Cabinets. We are still seeking donations in support of this project.
- **30th Anniversary.** This significant event is only a few weeks away now and the 30th Anniversary Team has been working exceptionally hard to make the celebration day a memorable one. If you know


anyone who has been part of the history of GGLC, please invite them personally to join us on July 2.

Growing My Faith Through An Internship Program

My name is Lachlan Ahrens. I am 22 years old, and I attend the evening services at GGLC. Since I graduated from Endeavour College in 2012 I have been studying mechatronic engineering at the University of S.A.

After a particularly draining year of study in 2015, I decided to take a one-year break to do something completely different. After exploring several options, I ended up spending 11 months in Anglesea, a small town at the start of the Great Ocean Road in Victoria, where I worked as an intern at a Christian camp site called Camp Wilkin. Camp Wilkin's internship program is a mixture of several things, including paid employment, a Certificate IV in Outdoor Recreation, and a Diploma in Theology.



Work at the camp site involved some cleaning, maintenance and kitchen work, but by far the largest part was running outdoor activities with school groups who stayed at the camp. Throughout the year we learned how to engage kids and keep them safe in bike riding, canoeing, rock climbing and teamwork activities, to name a few. Initially I was hesitant about working with kids, but I ended up enjoying it and I grew in many aspects of leadership.



The program had a strong emphasis on spiritual growth. In the theology studies we learned about church history, evangelism and Christology, and also did more practical units in leadership and personal development. We were required to attend a church and get involved in ministry;


my choice was to help lead the youth group at the local Baptist Church. The camp's ministry coordinator was very serious about God and about mission, and led the interns in passionate and often confronting devotions and bible studies, as well as providing one-on-one mentoring and support. Seeing him every day I developed a healthy fear of God and a desire to know Him more deeply and to align my life to His will.


One of the most challenging aspects of the internship was living on-site in a shared house with five other interns, aged between 18 and 20 and all with very different personalities. There was often conflict over dirty dishes, when to be quiet, whether or not it was necessary to label one's food in the fridge, and how often was often enough to shower. Through all these challenges and more, I learned the importance of showing love, offering forgiveness and being gentle.



The internship program encouraged my growth in all areas – mental, physical, emotional, spiritual, etc. I learned a lot about engaging with kids, teachers, fellow staff, bosses and people who are hard to get along with; I gained skills in outdoor activities and leadership; I learned more about God and the Christian faith, and applied that knowledge on a deeper level. I would recommend all school leavers and young adults to seriously consider a similar gap year experience.

I think God would have a little chuckle hearing me say this is one of my favourite bible verses, because I find it so hard to put into practice, and yet in hindsight I can see it is only God's strength that has got me through the hard times, and has moulded me to the person I am today. I have also found strength through music, and although God has given me a gift, and I play in church, I also suffer badly from nerves which at times makes playing quite difficult – so **it is only through God's strength I can use the gift he has given me.**

I grew up in a small country town, Goroke, in Victoria. My dad was the policeman, so my upbringing was quite strict on one hand, but also filled with love and a Christian foundation. We were active members of the Methodist church, and as a child I have many happy memories of Sunday school lessons and picnics at Mt Arapiles.

I came to Adelaide for my secondary schooling, and in my 2nd year I was confirmed in the Lutheran church. I went straight into nursing from college, training at the Women's and Children's hospital. It was at this time I became active with the Youth at St. Stephens Lutheran Church in Wakefield Street.

I have always loved my nursing whether it was in a hospital, or where I am now, in a Drs Surgery. If the opportunity arises I am very happy to share my faith, but if not, **showing God's love by example** is just as important.

Dave and I were married in 1973, and on our 1st wedding anniversary we arrived in Papua New Guinea for a 2 year contract working in the highlands. This was a wonderful experience for us both, and I was exposed to a very different kind of nursing. Although our contract was through the American Lutheran Mission, there was a mixture of denominations in our community, and we all worshiped together as one because there was only one church. It was sometimes

an interesting challenge working, socialising, and worshipping with the same people - **a big lesson in acceptance of others.**

About 10 years into our marriage our relationship hit a very rocky patch, and Dave and I were separated. I felt like I had "fallen out of love", and nothing was going to change that. Praying was very hard for me, but we had an amazing circle of friends and family **who never stopped praying for us both.** The only prayer I prayed every night was "God you know how I feel, you will have to change my heart for this marriage to work, I can't do it". Nearly 2 years later, 2 weeks before our court case to finalise our divorce, I woke up on a Sat morning with a changed heart, and knew that divorce was not the answer. Unbelievable! I said nothing, but asked God for me to feel the same way the next morning - and I did. I went to church, and we had a visiting Pastor who preached on the meaning of true **JOY...Jesus first, Others second, & Yourself last.** His sermon spoke to me and reinforced this change that had happened within me. I shared this incredible change with Dave that afternoon which brought him to tears.

I believe this is my miracle. God gave us back our marriage. We are now coming up to our 45th wedding anniversary. We have 2 amazing sons, Rick and Nathan, the best daughters-in-law Jo and Amanda, and 4 beautiful grandsons Noah, Theo, Hayden and Jack.

We still face many challenges in our life, but we face them together. **My faith is constantly a "work in progress"**, and although I know I have much to be grateful for, I still get angry with God at how unfair life can be at times, and why does it have to be so hard. Living our faith is such a "day by day" thing, and sometimes your steps are very small, but when you look back and see how far you have come, you realise it truly is only by the strength that God gives you.

The main aim of our Fellowship group is to help members of the Body of Christ.

Our Fellowship group is open to all and people are invited to attend through the notices in the Sunday Bulletin. We get together twice a month - once at Napier's house & once at the Schillers. Pastor Greg has arranged for us to pray for people during or after Salt Factory Service & at times we are invited to hospitals etc to pray or we can pray with people over the phone.

In healing though we do find that sometimes it does take some persistence - the first time with prayer you may receive 40% , come back again pray – get another 20% - Keep coming back until you get your full 100% (and sometimes it takes lots & lots of persistence)




One example of healing that occurred has been the growth of a leg that was 2 cms shorter than the other THANK YOU JESUS – This is the 5th person recently that has received healing or partial healing. A badly bowed leg that improved by 2cm (with about 5 minutes of prayer). We continue to see her for more prayer to receive further healing/ improvement.

We also pray for financial issues, depression & anxiety that way heavily on people and hinder the Body of Christ. We have many opportunities to pray for that. I was one of these People with depression and have now broken through with help from Paul Napier prayers (that took many months of persistence – but the chain's now been broken) . I also have a broken wrist that still remains out of position – I'm NOT supposed to be able to play golf or water ski, - I have NO pain and I use it like a normal Wrist but that took about 4 months of persistent praying for my wrist to receive healing (the arm went very hot for about 20 minutes)– since then it's been fantastic. .

I have seen some luke warm Christians receive healing & **their faith goes through the roof**. They are no longer luke warm. One example is Luke (a young man). He used to come a couple times a year. He saw his mate recover through prayer when doctors advised parents that he would be a vegetable or not much better. Luke had a broken wrist and felt heat go through his wrist, like welding the bones – not painful. When he went for a second x-ray to get the full cast on (a week after the break) – the break in the bone seen on the first x-ray was gone.


Luke now attends most salt factory services, is involved with Youth every Friday night, and is usually at our fellowship gatherings. He is now promoting to his fellow youth about how good Jesus is.

The Sunday Salt Factory Service held once a month will be a healing prayer service. It is held at Golden Grove Lutheran church at 6:30pm. All welcome.
