


Growing Jogether As God's Community

Created for Community





Highlights from Church Council

- *We welcome our <u>newcomers to Church Council</u> for 2017, Dave Shrowder representing the Pastoral Care Team, and Ruth Zimmerman representing the Christian Education Team.
- *<u>Church Council met</u> for the first time in 2017 in mid February. After the Christmas/New Year break, we had a lot of ground to cover.
- *Strategic Planning we have a busy year ahead as we look forward to our 30th anniversary celebrations in July, whilst at the same time planning renovations, ramping up Playgroup and CCs, revising our constitution and having just appointed a Youth Coordinator. Delivering on these plans is our focus for 2017.
- *GGLC Foyer Renovations including Coffee Space, Play space, Pastor's Office, Toilets. Phase 1 will include office & reception area, hospitality space & play area. Phase 2 the toilets. There are a few details left to sort out for Phase 1, but after several design iterations we feel we are converging on an appropriate and affordable solution. This will be presented to the congregation in the near future.
- *Sanctuary we have a design for the altar and other items in the sanctuary to mark our 30 years as a congregation. Again, there are just a few details to deal with, & this will be presented to the congregation soon. We hope that members will support this once-in-a-lifetime project with special donations to cover the cost.
- *Constitution updates have been reviewed by Church Council & have been sent to the District for the next step in the long journey toward sign-off.
- * <u>Children's Ministry</u> Natasha Jaeschke, previously employed for a limited term, has been reappointed to the casual role of Children's Ministry Worker on an ongoing basis.
- *Youth we welcome Paul Voigt as our Youth Coordinator, a part-time position starting March.
- *Pastor's Review as Pastor Greg has been with us for 1 year, it is LCA policy that a "Review of Ministry" is conducted. This will happen in the coming weeks.
- *Finance Our unaudited accounts from 2016 show a small surplus for the year. This is an outstanding result, given that when we were only a few months from the end of the year we were looking at a deficit of approximately \$20k. Thank you all for generously supporting your church.
- *Thank you to everybody who attended our Half-yearly Meeting in December.

Communication has been difficult with Asaroka due to problems with the phone network up there lately. We have now ascertained that the school year has begun with a total of 2500 students from years 10-12! They have cut the numbers of boarding students to help ease pressure on aspects of the infrastructure. Peter Hasu is again Principal. There has also been some building works happening around the School. The issues around building works, the work in preparing for the big numbers of students this year & having the school ready has meant that the container has yet to be unloaded. They are being careful to plan this, so things are done right and the goods can go directly to where they are needed. Peter is aware of what is in the container and is very happy about it.

We are looking to visit Asaroka later this year. If we can work it, we may be able to coincide our visit with the Goroka Cultural Show. I believe this is in early September. 2016 Working Legend Award

Geoff Thiel led the operations of R.M Williams for more than 20 years as Chief Operating Officer at the base at Salisbury South. Geoff is well known as a tireless worker and manager devoted to developing, coaching & mentoring. While manufacturing in Australia has been in decline over the past decade, Geoff has increased both capacity and staffing at R.M Williams with the workforce more than doubling under his watch. He has been a strong vocal advocate for better employment outcomes for families living the Northern Suburbs. Geoff played a leading role in the Dare To Lead program, which gave opportunities to disengaged indigenous students and hosted family days where local indigenous elders were able



to visit the plant. He has also been on a number of local Boards, most notably Northern Economic Leaders, which brings business leaders together to discuss innovative ways of supporting and growing economic activity in northern Adelaide.

- ♦ Golden Grove Lutheran Primary School has also had 4 Principals—Trevor Winderlich—installed 31st January 1988; Rainer Mayer—installed 5th February 1995; Daryl Trigg—installed February 2008 & Shane Paterson—installed March 2016.
- The church began as a friendship group on 13th April 1987 meeting in the home of Leanne & Tim
 Albers with Pastor Bartel & Anne, Tim & Leanne Albers, Jan & Jeff Wegner and Melitta Rogers.
- The church met in 7 different locations over 12 years. Pedare Christian College for 4:20pm worship; The Heights School for 11am worship; The Wynn Vale Primary School @ 11am and later 10am; Golden Grove Lutheran Primary School double classroom; the Wynn Vale State School Resource Centre, then to Wynn Vale State School Multi Purpose Hall and finally to our purpose built Worship Centre in 1999.
