

# **Pastor Greg Shares**

For the most part I am a positive person. When I take an inventory of my life, I see that I am richly blessed and I thank God for his provision. But there are times when I get down and I don't feel like rejoicing at all. Life's like that. We aren't constantly living a high; there are ups and downs. Our God knows the world and he knows our nature. So he has given us some much needed wisdom in **Philippians 4** to feed our heart:

**Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!** Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer & petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

The Christians at Philippi had quite a few things stacked against them and yet they remained joyful. Most of them were poor, they were on the edge of society because of their beliefs and there was a feud in the congregation. Doesn't sound so different from today really. But what we see in their reaction explains a lot about why they were joyful.

Paul tells us that the congregation was faithful and generous. When Paul was in need, they gave to him, despite their privations. He also talks about how their faith, despite their circumstances, causes him to thank God. There is much we can learn from the Philippians and it's about their orientation.

The Philippians looked outside themselves. Their faith was centred on Jesus and how he continues to be at work in their midst and they see whatever resources they have as gifts from God that are to be used in his

service. So simple and yet so difficult! It goes against our natural instincts to focus on things outside our wants. But this is what Paul commends them for. We too can experience joy apart from our circumstances when we shift our attention from what is happening to me, to what God is doing in my life. My everyday experiences will be up and down. Some days are good, some are bad. God, on the other hand, is at work all the time for good in my life. Seeing his action and responding with faith and generosity is a key to joy in life.









I (Rosalie Hoklas Editor of LITV) love the work of Max Lucado. He is a powerful story teller and has a wonderful way of sharing God's message. He is author of many books (many of which I have read) & preacher at Oak Hills Church in San Antonio, Texas. The children of our 2017 confirmation class received the book "Glory Days—Living Your Promised Land Life Now" by Max Lucado as a gift from the congregation. ## **Highlights from Church Council**

Jon Schutz - GGLC Chairperson

- I find that after two years as Chairperson all the work is done and now I can just put my feet up & the congregation runs itself smoothly like a well-oiled machine.
- ... is what I would have liked to have been able to say. Church Council met for the first time in 2018 in early February and the list of business was extensive. In the past, Council has met monthly but this year we will be trialling meeting on a 6-weekly basis; we were finding that as soon as we had completed one meeting we were preparing for the next, and then some meetings had to be cancelled due to conflict with school holiday dates, so we hope the 6-weekly regime will be a more efficient arrangement.
- We welcome our new members of Council for 2018: Noah Hahn as Youth Representative (with Luke Wachtel), Roger Kloeden as Property Representative, and Robert Mills as Extra Member.
- Building works for the foyer renovations including the café, Pastor's office and toilets began on Feb 19 and are scheduled to continue through to early July under Ivan's careful scrutiny. The deck component requires a little more engineering design and then we will be marshalling volunteers to help with that part of the work.



- Council has the privilege and challenge of dealing with all of the Big Decisions and of course one of them was to choose a café name and competition winner. It was a gruelling process all members of Council will attest to this but on Sunday Feb 18 it was my pleasure to announce the winning name and entry. Our café will be called "Café Connect" and we congratulate Leanne Crisp for submitting the winning entry. It was a close contest but "Café Connect" came out ahead because of its invitation to connect in fellowship, which is well aligned with the core values of GGLC and what we would like to achieve with the café.
- We are also very pleased to announce the formal and mutual endorsement of a "<u>Partnership</u> <u>Covenant"</u> between the congregation and the school. Stemming from discussions about the

school/church relationship throughout last year, and in particular from the school/church forum which was held on August 5, the Partnership Covenant is a declaration of how we see the shape of the school and church partnership and the undertakings of both parties to intentionally foster that relationship. A copy is included in this issue of Life in the Vine on page 5.

- I would have liked to have been able to report on our financial position at the end of 2017 but unfortunately the Life in the Vine deadlines and accounting system run on independent schedules. This information will be reported in due course so for now I will just reiterate that with building commencing and a new loan to repay, we ask for your continued support to maintain our budget in a balanced position.
- On our agenda for this year is to revisit our core value statements. Council has started the process of shortlisting values which we believe reflect the character of this congregation, but we also believe that the congregation should be actively involved in the process. We would like everyone to be able to articulate the core values and feel some ownership of them. More on this later in the year.
- Judith will be on leave from March 5, returning in the second week of April, and then Pastor Greg will be on leave from April 16, returning on July 9. Pastor Dennis Obst will be filling in while Pastor Greg is on leave.

## **OUR PARTNERSHIP COVENANT**

#### Preamble

While there is a clear understanding in both Church and School that the governance responsibilities for both are separate, there is also an equally clear understanding that both Church and School have been called by God into an inextricably linked partnership. We share: \* a common Mission and Ministry mandate from the Lutheran Church of Australia

- \* a shared history
- \* common geography.

This Partnership Covenant document seeks to describe what this partnership looks like in theory and practice.

#### **Our common vision**

To proclaim Christ to all who enter our community. This proclamation will be enacted according to our individual mission. Above all we aim to work together to make Christ known.

#### **Our common values**

We value: \* our Lutheran heritage of grace, the theology of the cross and the Sacraments

\* core values which reflect the characteristics of God: especially love, justice, compassion, forgiveness, service, humility, courage, hope, quality and appreciation

- \* open communication
- \* each community's independence and interdependence.

#### This partnership will show itself in:

- using "WE" language, not "US/THEY"
- always asking the question "How will this affect our partner?" when considering issues and making decisions
- championing the partner at every opportunity
- seeking opportunities to highlight our partner's activities and profile in our various communications
- orienting all new staff and Council members in both the content and importance of this Partnership Covenant.

#### **Principles**

In strengthening and promoting this relationship the Pastor and the Principal will work closely together, spending time in prayer and mutually supporting each other in their respective ministries.

It is acknowledged that the Principal is the spiritual head of the School and the Pastor's role in the school is one of support. It is expected that the Pastor will be welcomed into the school and through clearly articulated understandings will fulfil his pastoral duties in support of the mission of the School and Congregation.

To build the relationship with the school community, in line with its mission, the Congregation will:

## **1. endeavour to provide pathways** for primary school age children into a Christian life outside of school, specifically through: teaching of Step-Up and Confirmation; providing the Sacraments

- delivering an engaging child and youth ministry program
- Christian role modelling through involvement of youth from the congregation
- allocating Youth Worker time to build relationships with students
- an open invitation for school groups to participate in Sunday worship, in a format of their choice (for example, drama, dance, choir, video presentation, or by involvement in worship bands).

## **2. offer school families Christian support** beyond the boundaries of school life, through programs which the congregation delivers as part of its pastoral care ministry.

**3.** support Pastor exercising his discretion in involving himself in the school community, for up to 25% of his work time, typically for activities which are uniquely the domain of the Pastor, such as:

serving as a resource for the theological development of the staff,

supporting the Christian Studies curriculum of the School,

- serving as a spiritual counsellor to the staff,
- supporting the worship program of the school,
- ministering to the whole School community.
- being a member of Class Carers.

## **4. promote opportunities for members to build relationships** with the school community through social events / activities **To build the relationship with the Congregation, in line with its mission the School will:**

1. actively support the ministry of the Pastor in the School and after consultation with the Pastor and Chair of the Congregation delegate to Pastor clearly defined authority in these areas.

2. encourage involvement of staff, students and families in the life of the congregation in practical ways such as: participating in congregational programs ; participating in music ministry; attendance at worship services



For 30 years the Golden Grove community has had the blessing of a school on site as part of the congregation. During the intervening years from the 80's to now, education has changed, the relationship doesn't look quite the same as it once did and many of the school's families don't have the church or Christian background that our founding and early families had. However, **the one constant over the last 30 years is our unshakeable faith in God and our desire to share this with all who come through our doors.** 

Lutheran Education Australia on its website writes about the uniqueness of Lutheran schools through the following:

- A Lutheran school provides a caring environment
- A Lutheran school embraces high standards of teaching and learning
- A Lutheran school is part of the greater community
- A Lutheran school promotes Christian growth and development.

As a school we certainly identify with these statements and see them in practice daily. Through our school the Holy Spirit is able to work in the lives of all our community members. Whether it be through the caring and supportive work of the Class Carers, through the nurturing, guidance and encouragement of staff, or via the connections with the congregation (eg. Playgroup, CC's, GGAF), we observe Christian service.

Through all of this we thank and praise God for his unconditional love towards us: we can <u>rejoice in Him always</u>. We rejoice for what has occurred here over 30 years, what is occurring now and we look forward to the future with hope as it is through God that this community has grown and been blessed to share the message of salvation with many, many people.


#### "Trust in the Lord with all your heart & lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

The girl's dorm has opened and the young women have moved in. The opening and use of this building will ease the boarding arrangements where overcrowding has been an issue in recent years.


The school thanks us for our continued prayers and pray that God will bless us all.

# Pastoral Care at GGLC in 2018.

Our official role as a Pastoral Care Team is to:

1. **care for people** who are not already being cared for;

2. be **available to care** at worship and fellowship events;

3. **integrate**, **disciple** and **challenge** members and new contacts to the congregation;

4. **encourage an atmosphere of care** and inclusion. In line with the above, we see a long term role also to develop a culture within the congregation where members continually care for and share with each other.

At the beginning of 2017 we weren't too sure how we might achieve that long term goal, however, as a result of the joint Pastoral Care & Christian Education Survey several issues became apparent:

1. Many people would prefer the Pastor to provide care for them when needed.

\*\*Pastor Greg has taken this on board and will do his best at this stage to provide the care that is needed, and we as a Team will support him in the best ways we can.

\*\*In the long term this would mean some of Pastor Greg's time might be taken from other ministry areas. This will be reviewed regularly.

## 2. Many people would like to be connected via a small group / friendship group.

**\*\***It's actually exciting to see the desire for groups in our congregation

\*\*As a result of comments and suggestions from the congregation Forum held after the survey, these groups will be called **"Connect Groups"**.

\*\*Initially Pastor Greg and I will be identifying who is currently in an active small group of any sort.

\*\*At our recent Pastoral Care Team a list of potential Connect Group Leaders was identified.


\*\*Once Leaders are confirmed for the groups we will meet with those Leaders and help determine who might fit most comfortably into each group. Careful consultation will be needed at this stage. \*\*We will be stressing the importance of people being comfortable in their groups. We would like people to feel comfortable enough to be honest. If someone doesn't feel comfortable in a particular group we will do our best to find a suitable group for them.

\*\*Membership in a group is not compulsory, but obviously spiritual growth can occur more readily when people are "connected".

In the long term the development of our **Connect Groups** will be the ideal vehicle to develop the culture mentioned earlier where we become a congregation of members continually caring for and sharing with each other. This in turn will ease the caring workload for Pastor Greg so he can perhaps focus on other ministry areas as well.



# Teaching Saturday A Bible Overview

Held on January 20th, 2018



Guest speaker **Dr John Kleinig** presented 3 sessions on the day, providing an overview of the Bible along with insights relevant to worship and our daily lives.

At the beginning of the first session, 'Introduction to the Bible', Dr Kleinig asked the question, 'How do you get to know God? reminding us that it is through His word that we not only deepen our relationship with God, we also receive spiritual enrichment, knowledge along with heavenly wisdom for our earthly life! Dr Kleinig also suggested that we should view the Bible as a 'practical handbook' for worship, meditation and prayer.

Session 2 focussed on the **Pentateuch.** In discussing God's covenant with Abraham, Dr Kleinig stated that God often works opposite to what we think. Each of us is encouraged to **'Look for the unexpected'** when reading God's word.

The last session of the day centred on the **gospels**, outlining the purpose of the gospels as proclamation of the risen Lord Jesus. Dr Kleinig reminded us that the gospel writers saw the same things but from different views and that no one person can give an adequate description of Jesus. **Each writer presents us with a different picture of Jesus**.

Matthew: Jesus as the promised Messianic King Mark: Good news of Jesus as God's Son Luke: Jesus as the Saviour of all people.

# John: A book of signs showing who Jesus is & what he offers.

Luke in his Gospel emphasises that 'Jesus comes to announce his amnesty to all people'. The focus is on saving all who are lost in all ways. In conclusion Dr Kleinig reiterated that Jesus reveals himself again and again to each of us through 'word and deed/word and sacrament'. '**God comes as Jesus to meet with us'.** 

Overall the day provided much food for thought at both a personal and congregational level. The concept that impacted me the most was when Dr Kleinig briefly touched on 'hospitality' as detailed a number of times in the Gospel of Luke and what that may mean for us today. Food for thought!
