

Each time we place a humble, made-with-love decoratio we think about Mary that first Christmas.


#### And Mary said:


"My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant.

<u>Star:</u> this reminds us of the star that the Wise Men followed to find the Newborn King.


<u>Presents:</u> this reminds us of the very first Christmas gift that God gave to us – His son Jesus.



## **Highlights from Church Council**

Jon Schutz - GGLC Chairperson

- In my first Life in the Vine article as Chairperson, I said that the "Church Council itself doesn't 'do' the ministry, but it's there to make sure it happens". Reflecting on that it is pleasing to see how Ruth and Dave have picked up their leadership roles in Christian Education and Pastoral Care respectively and we are starting to see some exciting developments as a result. Some have been well publicised such as the upcoming one-day seminars and 4-week course but other things are also happening behind the scenes and having a positive impact on the lives of people in our community.
- GGLC Foyer Renovations including Coffee
   Space, Play space, Pastor's Office, Toilets after
   a long period of planning, we are almost at the
   point of starting to build.
- The Finance Team met in September and has produced a provisional budget for Congregational approval at the Half Yearly Meeting. About 65% of our budget is invested in people, paying the salaries of Pastor, Pastor's Secretary, Children's Ministry Worker and Youth Coordinator, and training. 24% is allocated to utilities and property costs, including loan repayments. 6% is allocated to the LCA SA/NT District, leaving 5% for various other running costs.
- Our 2017 budget position is a concern. Projections based on figures to the end of October point to an end of year deficit of \$30,000, in part due to extraordinary expenses such as the altar and sanctuary furniture that were commissioned as part of our 30th Anniversary. Setting aside extraordinary expenses, donations are falling \$17,500 short of the budgeted figure. Last year at the same time our budget was in a similar position, but thanks to the support of members we ended with a very small surplus.
- With building commencing and a new loan to repay, we would like to enter 2018 on a firm financial footing, so we ask again for your support to bring our budget back to a balanced position. Details of how contributions can be made are in the weekly bulletin and e-news.

- At the end of this year, Daniel Dutschke will be stepping down as Property Coordinator and Allyson Dutschke will be retiring from the position of ChildSafe Coordinator. Daniel will continue to support the Property Team. Also Alexandra Schmocker will finish her service on Church Council as Youth representative. We thank them all for their valuable contributions.
- It has been a big year with the 30th Anniversary celebrations as a highlight, but we have much to look forward to for the coming year!

# Children's Ministry By Natasha Jaeschke

Kid's @ Heart

Golden Grove Lutheran Church children's ministry involves a partnership with parents to guide children towards the HEART of GOD. Children are a blessing from the Lord. With these blessings also come responsibilities. As stewards of God's children, parents are responsible for helping children grow physically, intellectually, emotionally and spiritually. Churches also have a responsibility toward children. We want to provide an environment in which children are safe, are taught at an age-appropriate level, and are encouraged to develop a relationship with Jesus Christ. Highlights of this ministry are:

<u>Mainly Music</u> -Each week, parents & caregivers bring their children for a thirty minute session of music, rhyme, movement, listening and more. The adults must participate in the session, and in fact, it is vital that they do so, because this encourages the children to enter into the actions and singing. In Term 3 and 4 it was all about making music where the children used a variety of instruments culminating in a percussion band. The number of children participating is slowly growing with an average of eight each session.



**Kids @ Heart** - is a ministry based program held during Sunday morning worship at 9:30am. We recently learned about the Lutheran Reformation which celebrated 500 years in 2017. We also discovered why the "Wise man built his house upon the rock" and what message Jesus was teaching us through the "Parable of the bags of gold/talents".

For each of these topics the children have viewed and discussed abstract art, viewed YouTube animation of the story, found the book of Matthew in the Bible - as well as enjoying dancing and

singing to biblical songs. Everyone loves Kids@Heart!

<u>CC's - Children of Christ</u> is an opportunity for members of Golden Grove Lutheran Church to assist and serve the children of Golden Grove Lutheran Primary School, thus forming strong connections. # Asaroka Partnership





Asaroka High School was started in 1962 by our member Pastor Len Tscharke and was from years 7-10, a continuation of the Primary School grade levels. These schools were the first English speaking Lutheran Primary & High Schools in the highlands.

Our Partnership began with our first visit in 2006,

Our Partnership began with our first visit in 2006, after Pastor Len and Claire saw that the school was not in good shape and he felt a strong calling from God to assist.

In 2006, the School had 800 students. In 2017 School has approx 2500 students, with 1,000 of them boarders. Many students have become day scholars and they walk or bus to school. There are 65 teachers, including Principal Peter Hasu and 3 Deputies. Due to the lack of teacher housing on campus many need to travel to school each day.

Asaroka High School was **granted Secondary School status in 2010,** with the first Year 12's graduating in 2011. In 2016 they graduated 320 year 12s.

Asaroka High School has a proud history of helping produce many country and community leaders.

To date we have had 6 groups from Golden Grove visit Asaroka with 34 different members, within a wide range of age groups. We have had 2 visits from the Schools to us. Once the Primary and Secondary Principals and another time the Secondary Principal and several department heads.



Early practical help achievements

included: Helping to set up the schools first computer suite, repairs to the important water

system for the farm, repairs to the farm machinery, stocking the library with books, the supply of many text books and installing a phone system into the school. The Primary School built a new building to house a computer suite and library which we have stocked.



We have now supplied 3 containers of school resources. While focus is on the secondary school due to their great needs, we have also supplied many resources to the Primary & the Elementary Schools. While it has been important to help the schools in a practical way, a large *focus of our Partnership is about Relationships and Encouragement.* The results of this has been quite significant in the reunification of the local communities with regards to their support of the schools and the importance of education to their children.



They have done much in and around their schools to build on new infrastructure and improve what was there and their programmes. The Outreach Team is active. Teams of students go into villages on weekends to support the residents and run Christian programmes.

The Principal Peter Hasu has said that his goal is that every student has a personal relationship with God by the time they finish their schooling there.

They greatly appreciate the support – all done with the love of Jesus.

Asaroka believes the partnership is here to stay as long as Golden Grove & Asaroka exist.



## 2017 Team Reflects On Their Trip To PNG



Daniel Dutschke (team leader) I was last in Asaroka with my family in 2011. Back then, I had seen improvements in the infrastructure (since my trip in 2007). New classrooms & other buildings painted. Since then the PNG Government started it's Free Education policy which saw the numbers rise very dramatically at most schools. Asaroka went from about 1000 to 2500 students with class sizes of 80 in some instances. This has put a huge strain on all there, Principal, staff, students & the infrastructure. There are now more buildings and more happening currently and planned, to try to cope with these numbers. They are so grateful for the resources we have sent them and are trying hard to manage

and use them carefully & efficiently. While there, we could sense the strain they were all under in the post-election period they were in and were very grateful to the school for the time we were given

and the staff who spent valuable time with us. We know they had to play 'catch up' with their own work when they returned to the school at the end of the day with us. The school management has to be very prudent with what money they have & use it wisely where there is the greatest need at the school, which means other areas may miss out. We all need to be very supportive of this regardless of our own thoughts and continue to keep them in our prayers. We had some beautiful times with them, including a Partnership Re-Dedication with Martin Akira on the Sunday at Church at Asaroka. The encouragement we continue to give them gives them the strength to continue in their valuable work of both 'Kingdom Building' and 'Nation Building'.

We also had some great time with Himony, Ennie (guest house), Helen Rende, Pastor Baitel from St Johns and some of the other Nurses who continue the friendships begun many years ago. The encouragement all these others get from our friendships (& we from them), is also so important in our relationship building up there. Their love for us is very clear. They know we are there as friends, to love and support them all as one family in Christ.







**Allyson Dutschke** Returning to Asaroka and Goroka in September felt like visiting family – it was a delight to renew relationships with many people we had met 6 years ago, and to see what has changed in their lives, while also sharing what God has done in ours.

One frequent question was: "where are Karl and Sarah?" as many remembered them travelling with us. Having taken photos with us, it was very special to share these with our friends.

One young man made himself known to us – Emmanuel Nando – he and Karl became good mates during our previous visit, and it was very special to tell him about what Karl was doing and find out that Emmanuel was also now studying at University. (He even still had the family photo from 6 yrs. ago – so we updated it with a new one)

Another very special person we wanted to visit was - Osborne Tinkeo, however we were only able to see briefly when he came to the airport before we were leaving. He is the son of our beautiful sister Siam, who passed away in 2016. It was very special that we could meet with him and share some precious time together before we flew home. These two young men are our 'Sons', and we think of them often and keep them in our prayers.

My other special times were the worship opportunities – at St. John's in Goroka, and also with the Asaroka school community. The worship with these people is very heartfelt and genuine, and while it

may not have the 'polish' we like to give the services in our church, there is a great sense of faith and connection – both with each other and with Christ. To be part of these experiences leaves you feeling very warm and embraced. Oh, and being included in the receiving line with Pastor Baitel after church in Goroka was lovely – shaking the hands and receiving blessing from many – including many of the nurses who have visited here with us previously.

It was a lovely trip, full of blessings, and I look forward to returning again. The partnership continues and the next trip will be sometime between July-September 2019







**Ken Tscharke** The visit to Papua New Guinea recently was a very enjoyable & a blessed time. It was a time to reconnect with the people at the Asaorka schools, and with our many friends in the town of Goroka. I particularly enjoy meeting the local people, as many of them were previously living near us at the Asaroka Lutheran Secondary School many years ago. (Our family lived at the Asaroka school in the 1960's and early

1970's.) Some of the people have since passed away, but many are still living and are involved within the Lutheran Church, live in Goroka town

and near the Asaroka schools.

I have often found most people in Papua New Guinea to be guite open to the Christian faith. It often happens when shopping in their supermarkets. to hear Christian music being played through the speakers. (Hillsong, hymns, are often played within their shops.) In Australia we can learn a lot from them about their openness to the Christian faith.

It is always a real blessing for us as a group to spend time in worship with the people. They always love music and the playing of guitars in worship. May God bless our partnership relationship with the schools at Asaroka.

#### <u>Pastor Greg</u> PNG, a Land of Grace

Lukim yu' our PNG friends said to us as we left Goroka airport. It means 'see you later'. As I boarded the plane I promised myself that we would definitely see each other again soon. Even before our flight from Goroka to Port Moresby landed I felt sad that I wouldn't be able to see my beautiful

PNG brothers and sisters for another two years.

Jesus commanded us to 'Love one another. As I have loved you, so

you must love one another' (John 13:34), and that's what we experienced when we shared 10 days at Asaroka. Everywhere we went our team was showered with love and the grace of Jesus. Staff at the school gave up their entire week to work with us, despite having an increased academic workload because of the late start of term. After serving us all day, these teachers returned to school & worked late into the night & then collected us early the following day. We never witnessed their sacrifice; all we saw was their willingness to give unconditionally. This is the essence of our partnership. Grace given & grace received. Worshipping with the school community on the last Sunday enacted our union, with Christ at the head. We bless each other because we first received from Jesus and we come together to glorify God with our common faith. There was an experience of the Holy Spirit during worship as if God himself was anointing this relationship. There is no doubt I have been changed by this visit with our brothers and sisters in PNG. Reflecting on our trip over the last few months I believe that we receive far more from them than they receive from us. I would encourage us all to prayerfully consider joining the Asaroka ministry team. Everyone who visits Asaroka is moved in Spirit. As Jesus' disciples our faith is refreshed.

I went there expecting a third world country and it certainly is, but it's changing unbelievably fast. Rubbish is burnt in the streets but lots of people have mobile phones. People walk everywhere but I saw more Toyota Landcruisers than I did in Coopers Creek.

I find it amazing how well the people have adapted to change so far but can't help wondering how they will go in the future as more and more western

influence is brought to them.

The number of schools and churches was also a surprise. Given that Asaroka is not on the main road but rather at the end of a very ordinary dirt road I can see the school is going to have to work hard to remain an in demand school. The connection and support of the Golden Grove Church has certainly been an important part of that success and that support will be needed into the future.



On Sunday 26th November, 5 young people reaffirmed their faith in their Lord Jesus during the confirmation service. Pastor Greg has journeyed with them over 18 months teaching & guiding them on their faith journey. Please pray for them & encourage them as they continue to grow in their knowledge and love of Jesus.



The purpose of confirmation instruction is the edification (building up) of a confirmand in the Christian faith. Put another way, it is to help the confirmand:

- · Personally confess Jesus Christ as their Lord and Saviour and take personal ownership in declaring, by the power of the Holy Spirit, their own allegiances to Christ.
- · Eagerly explore the awe and blessings of God and the mysteries of the Christian faith.

Today they confirm their faith that was confessed and given at their baptism. Each confirmand shared their faith and a love for Jesus that they expressed in a Faith Statement.

# There's never been a better time to be a Christian

The following are sections from an article written in 'Vox Point' Nov 2017, the National Magazine of Family Voice Australia. It was based on an address by Campbell Markham at the Hobart launch of the Coalition for Marriage on 7th Sept. What a mess our poor nation is in. There is so much conflict, so much confusion, so much pain. We have forgotten what a human being is. Our freedom to speak is dissolving before our eyes.

#### But there has never been a better time to be a

**Christian.** There are two reasons why I believe this to be true. <u>First</u> because we have the answer to what the world is crying out for.

Our nation has been deceived. It has been told that divorce doesn't matter, that pornography is harmless, that gender is fluid etc and that anyone who says different ought to be prosecuted. Millions have been hurt by these lies.

#### But there has never been a better time to be a

**Christian.** We have the bible. We have the word of God, a bright light in the darkness. It shows us the wonderful truth that human beings are crafted in God's image with dignity, value & purpose.

There has never been a better time to be a Christian, because we get to tell people about God's good plan. The *second* reason is because we are beginning to

experience the joy of persecution.

When the disciples were arrested for refusing to shut up about the resurrection of Jesus, they were beaten. But they responded with joy: "The apostles left rejoicing....they never stopped teaching & proclaiming that Jesus is the Christ."

There is nothing trite about joyfulness. It is about that deep & wide river of confidence, security, & peace that comes from believing Jesus when he said: "Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

How tempting to respond to insults & persecution with anger & bitterness. No, we will never be cowed into silence by persecution. Out of love for our community we will fight anti-discrimination laws that attack our basic human

freedoms of expression, of conscience, of religion. We will be angered for the lies that hurt our community, but we not be angry for ourselves. Instead we will respond to personal attacks with an unshakable joy, confidence and peace: for the persecution shows that we are walking in the footsteps of Jesus, & with the presence of Jesus.

There has never been a better time to be a Christian—I speak from personal experience. My colleague & I have been summoned to explain ourselves before the State's antidiscrimination Commissioner. Having being threatened with prosecution, we now get to tell our nation about our Saviour Jesus Christ, & it is worth a thousand persecutions. Many lament that the debate over marriage is not an even (fair) fight. We have truth on our side. We have Jesus on our side: the Creator, Immanuel, God With Us. In the fight between truth & error, the world versus the church, it is not an even fight.

There has never been a better time to be a Christian, because although in God's providence the word marriage may come to be redefined in our laws, & although it might be counterfeited, or obscured for a time, the thing itself, the beautiful institution that God created, cannot be lost. God's people can seize this moment. We can seize the opportunity to speak out in love to protect our nations understanding of marriage. Do not fear. Pray, tell people about Jesus with courage, passion & compassion. And when you are opposed, let your peace & joy be seen—

Jesus in us—be seen.


