Anointed and Tested

Just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased." At once the Spirit sent him out into the wilderness, and he was in the wilderness forty days, being tempted by Satan. Mark 1:10-13a

So many of the biblical heroes endured a period of testing before they served in their ultimate calling. Joseph and Daniel both suffered for their fidelity to God and remained confident of God's providence in the face of tough times. Even King David was hunted

by Saul before he ascended to the throne of Israel. All of these leaders were anointed for significant roles in the life of God's people.

It's important to note that God does not test us to find what we can bear or expose our breaking points. Whenever we see God testing someone it is to demonstrate his power in times of trouble. Joseph was given dreams, Daniel was saved from the lions and David was protected from Saul. We see that the anointing of God has real, powerful effects in the life of the believer. And in the account of Jesus baptism and testing, we see a model of anointing and testing that many will experience as members of God's Kingdom.

We are all called to be a holy priesthood, where we speak and act on behalf of Jesus in our vocations. Today we acknowledge the special callings of our School Council and staff. We also celebrate God's gift of a new leader for our school as Mr Wallace is installed. We pray for God's anointing and his presence in times of testing and blessing. *Pastor Greg*

Mark 1:9-15





Holding Cross

A holding cross is also sometimes called a pocket cross, comfort cross, or caring cross. These small crosses are designed to fit comfortably into the palm of your hand as a tactile aid to prayer. Use it as a spiritual companion for easing children's

fears, to comfort worries and stresses of adults and to focus the prayer of the sick and elderly.

> A holding cross is designed not so much to look right as to feel right

When we literally or figuratively hold on to the cross of Jesus, we trust that he hears us and will be

with us. Sometimes it is enough to hold the cross silently—this is itself prayer. Trusting in the cross and what it means forgiveness and life forever with Jesus—we can sincerely pray, both for ourselves and others.
