Jesus cleanses the Temple

In the temple he found those who were selling oxen and sheep and pigeons, and the money-changers sitting there. And making a whip of cords, he drove them all out of the temple, with the sheep and oxen. And he poured out the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables. And he told those who sold the pigeons, "Take these things away; do not make my Father's house a house of trade." John 2:14-16

We're not used to seeing an angry Jesus. Our view of him is mostly one of love, grace and acceptance because the foundational message of the bible is that God loves us and sacrificed himself for us. What we see in the account of Jesus cleansing the temple is that there are some things that our Lord will not accept.

Jesus' own words tell us why he was so upset. He was disgusted to see that a place of worship was turned into a place of business. While there is nothing wrong with business, it should not get in the way of our worship and dedication to God. Business can be conducted outside the temple. When we enter God's house it is for the purpose of connecting with him only.

For us, we are encouraged to examine ourselves and see if there is anything in our lives that is getting in the way of seeing Jesus. It could be business or recreation or even family. All these things are blessings that flow from our relationship with God not things that replace it. This Lent may His Holy Spirit draw us closer to God.

Andrew McDonough, author of Cecil the lost sheep is holding sessions at the Adelaide Fringe from March 4-19. A great family activity!


About this event

Andrew McDonough's only life skill is the ability to draw a sheep marginally better than your average 7 year old. Bereft of other career options, Andrew has used his solitary skill to churn out 32 children's books that have been surprisingly popular amongst small children yet to develop a critical literary palate. When not in Covid lockdown, Andrew travels Australia & internationally giving storytelling performances and running workshops in schools, churches and conferences. Holding Cross

A holding cross is also sometimes called a pocket cross, comfort cross, or caring cross. These small crosses are designed to fit comfortably into the palm of your hand as a tactile aid to prayer. Use it



as a spiritual companion for easing children's fears, to comfort worries and stresses of adults and to focus the prayer of the sick and elderly. When we literally or figuratively hold on to the cross of Jesus, we trust that he hears us and will be with us. Sometimes it is enough to hold the cross silently-this

is itself prayer. Trusting in the cross and what it means-forgiveness and life forever with Jesuswe can sincerely pray, both for ourselves and others.
