



David and the Ark of the Covenant

Wearing a linen ephod, David was dancing before the Lord with all his might, while he and all Israel were bringing up the ark of the Lord with shouts and the sound of trumpets. 2 Samuel 6:14-15

From ancient times, the Ark of the Covenant was the place where the presence of God dwelt. The Israelites believed it was much more than symbolic; they believed that something truly of God actually inhabited the space right above the Ark. It was treated with great reverence and handled carefully. For a long time the Ark had been somewhat neglected because people were afraid that God's presence would cause them harm.

In this scripture we see how King David is different. God's presence does not terrify him, rather he will do whatever he can to be close to God. So David collects the Ark and transports it to Jerusalem. It is easy to imagine that the people would be hesitant to be too close to the Ark. In response, David wants all to know that God is for Israel and he is their God, and that is something to be celebrated. David dances in a joyous procession, allaying fears and encouraging worship.

As Christians sent into the world we also have a responsibility to proclaim the love and grace of God to people who are reluctant to be close to him. As was the case in David's time, today many do not understand the heart of God and put themselves a safe distance away. It is our calling to go to them, with the presence of God so that God and people can be close. May we be as joyful as David in this mission. *Pastor Greg*







