TWO MINUTES

Luke 10: 38-42 Mary or Martha - Your Choice?

I have always thought that Martha seems to get a 'bad rap' when you hear explanations regarding the story of Mary and Martha. We are told that Mary chose to sit at Jesus' feet, absorbed in His teaching, while Martha ran around like a headless chook attending to the chores and then complained about it. We are told that it is good to take 'time out' and that we should be like Mary. We even feel guilty when we get too 'busy' in our lives to be good 'Marys'. In reality though we will always be a combination of Mary and Martha. We can't sit around all day lost in God's word, no matter how awesome it is. There is a time for work, for living as well. So what's the real point of today's Gospel? Our lives are filled with choices, priorities, even anxieties and troubles as well as joy. At the beginning of Creation God purposely made us each with a free will to cope with the many choices of life. Often we change our choices and sometimes our decisions are changed for us or even reversed. Jesus teaches us that there is however one choice that cannot be taken back and that choice is Jesus Himself. Mary knew the rich and glorious secret of God that St Paul proclaims in his letter to the Colossians; that when you choose Jesus you allow him into your heart and your life fully and completely. So Mary made her choice and Jesus also encouraged Martha to come and sit and learn so that she too could choose. It's the same one choice that all mankind needs to make.

Prayer: Holy Spirit search my heart now to see if I have chosen Jesus in the most deep and intimate way. If not, guide me to make that one choice needful, Jesus my Saviour and my Lord. Amen Michael Gower

- I have been giving out (mainly through the pigeon holes) an invitation to the leader's retreat on 20th October. If you are a leader in the congregation and have failed to get one, please see me. (I am sorry for this oversight.)
- •We've been holding "healing services" on the 3rd Sunday of each month for the last 4 months but the attendance hasn't been going up yet (in fact quite the contrary). (I realize that the last one was in the middle of the school holidays.) In a discussion after the last healing service we pondered why people aren't attending. We considered factors like the name of the service, the time and place and possibly that people don't feel that it's for them because they aren't sick. The thought was also offered that some might consider it threatening. However, we agreed that we love that with the healing service we have 3 opportunities a month to have Holy Communion on a Sunday morning, that you can (if you request it) have hands laid on you and be anointed with oil for healing, give your testimony, discuss Bible readings in worship and that the Worship Centre is so versatile that the numbers in attendance isn't really a factor. The healing service is a reminder that we all need healing. The next service is planned for 19th August, 11am in the Worship Centre for all us sinners who are sick.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As you may be aware, Brett Copeland and I have both been involved in instructing the confirmation or "Next Step" class, and also in revising the constitution of GGLF.

About 4 years ago, several members of the congregation including Pastor Alex Stevenson and Rainer Mayer met to discuss the goals and methods of instructing confirmation lessons. The "Next Step" was set up as a temporary answer for this. As recent instructors of this course, we believe strongly that the purpose and content of "Confirmation" needs to be reassessed at a congregational level at GGLF.

Coincidently (or as we believe, God-incidentally), one of the issues that is proving to be most contentious in the discussions around the constitution revision, is the issue of membership – or more specifically, "confirmed members" e.g. What do we mean by confirmed members? Would somebody who has been instructed in an "Alpha"-type confirmation course be recognized as a "confirmed" member in another Lutheran congregation? Is there a core component that we as a congregation believe all "confirmees" should know? Should "confirmation" be an automatic component of Year 7 in a Lutheran School? Is there a minimum age for confirmation, or for voting members? Who needs to be confirmed? These are but a few of the questions we are asking ourselves and the other constitution committee members and of course, Pastor Leon Rosenberg.

The purpose of this letter is to invite your input, so that as a united Church family we may come to know God's will in dealing with this issue. We appreciate that you may have questions, or particular views about what confirmation does/does not entail and we would value any thoughts you have. We are planning to have an open discussion on **Sunday 5th of August at 5.00 pm** in the Worship Centre, to answer questions and more specifically, listen to your ideas and views. If this is not convenient to you, or you would prefer to write down your views rather than speak about them publicly, please feel free to leave a note for us at the church office, or email either of us at the addresses below. Rather than have the expectation that we will come to a conclusion by the end of the 5th August meeting, we see this as the beginning of the discussion.

In the meantime, you may find the following questions helpful in generating your thoughts, prayer, study of scripture and discussion amongst your household and friendship group.

- What is meant by a "member" of the church and by GGLF?
- What is the obligation of GGLF towards its members?
- What is the obligation of members towards GGLF?
- How do we as a congregation care for our members and how does this extend to the GGLP school community?
- What is the purpose of confirmation/Next Step?
 Are there minimum requirements we expect of the confirmation curriculum? Who should be confirmed? Should lack of confirmation be a mechanism for exclusion?
