TWO MINUTES

The Fire we go through.

"I have come to bring fire to the earth, and I wish that my task were already completed" (Luke 12:49)

These words from the Gospel reading are hard words from Jesus.

We think of Him bringing love, joy, peace ... (the fruit of the Spirit). Isn't this why we come to church?

But there is another side. He promises us turmoil as well. When Jesus finds someone, the Gospel has done it's work and a person's life is changed, there is bound to opposition to it - opposition even in that person's family. We see that clearly in inter-faith families (eg. a person comes to the Christian faith in Egypt and the rest of the family who are still Islamic turn on him - See "Bibles for the Persecuted" which is being promoted today). We also see it when a person takes their faith seriously and the rest of the family feels as though they have become too zealous.

Jesus goes onto say that this is a sign of the times. It is showing that the Gospel is at work.

The word of comfort in all this is that Jesus knows the turmoil we are going through. He suffered and died for the truth. But he also rose again – he is with us through our turmoil. And indeed he does send us the Holy Spirit who will produce that fruit in us - even in the midst of the turmoil - the fire we are going through.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, please help us when we have turmoil in our family and with others around us because of the Gospel. Thank you for this word of prophecy. Thank you that you know what we are going through, you are going through it with us and you send your Holy Spirit to help us through it. May we become stronger through these hard times as you refine us. Amen. **Pastor Leon**

Pastor's Corner



- Today "Answer Accusation" is the topic for the sermon. The sermon is based on Revelation 12: 9, 10- This great dragon—the ancient serpent called the Devil, or Satan, the one deceiving the whole world—was thrown down to the earth with all his angels. Then I heard a loud voice shouting across the heavens, "It has happened at last—the salvation and power and kingdom of our God, and the authority of his Christ! For the Accuser has been thrown down to earth—the one who accused our brothers and sisters before our God day and night.
- Don't forget about the **Healing Service** at 11am this morning.
- Welcome to the Klose family who have joined us this morning for **Aidan's Baptism**
- In a month's time (21st September) we are having our first **Holy Communion at the Friday morning service**. This is a trial. It reminds us that Friday morning "chapel" is a legitimate worship service of our congregation. If you are able, please join us.
- Note that we are offering "**Step up to Communion**", starting on the 14th September. If you are about 10 or older and want to know more about communion or if you know someone in this situation please consider this opportunity. We expect a number of people will be taking their first communion on 21st October.
- This coming week I shall be joining the team to go to PNG to represent you in our ministry of support and encouragement at **Asaroka**. Please remember to pray for us in our absence from you. Next Sunday Pastor Jim Prenzler will leading the service in the morning and Ivan Schmocker will be speaking at Salt Factory.
- I have noticed that a few people have felt the need to **take time off** from different roles in our worship roster. I understand that all need to take a break from time to time. I hope these people don't feel burnt out or not valued by our congregation (They certainly haven't indicated that to me). Remember when we feel burnt out we could be trying to do something by our own strength instead of relying on the Lord or trying to do more than what the Lord wants of us. Also the Lord values what we are doing if we are doing it to His glory, even when we don't feel that anyone notices or cares. Keep in mind: when we are in an awkward situation because people have pulled out we are more likely to rely on the Lord.
- It is estimated that over 200 million Christians in over 60 countries face persecution on a daily basis....Would you like to be part of the *Bibles for the Persecuted Church Program*? It starts on the 2nd September and runs until Sunday 23rd September. You will receive a 21 day devotional booklet with reports from countries where Christians are being persecuted for their faith and a Bible money box. The idea is to use the devotional booklet each day and put money in the money box (eg. 41 per day for the 21 days will enable the Bible League to put a Bibles in 3 households in country where Christians are persecuted. See the map on the notice board for what countries we are talking about). The boxes will be collected on 30th September. Please collect your box and devotional book from the table in the foyer.
