#### **TWO MINUTES**

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. 2 Timothy 3:16,17

I read with interest Linda MacQueen's editorial in the latest edition of *The Lutheran*. I assume from the comments she made that she's copped some criticism for her writings and I liked the yardstick she applies to know whether to take the comments seriously or not. She relies on God's Word to direct her thinking – are the comments tempered with the fruit of the Spirit, are they 'useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness', or are they petty and critical for criticism's sake?

We don't like to think of the 'rebuking and correcting' part of God's Word, do we? Or is that just me? In this me-me-me age we live in, where we are the centre of the universe, it hurts to have our faults and shortcomings revealed to us, to be rebuked and corrected. But for me to grow in my faith, to be trained in righteousness and thoroughly equipped for every good work, God reveals the ugliness within, moulds me as a potter (feels like pummelling sometimes!), then completely douses me with his grace and mercy and sets me on my way so He can use me for every good work. May He continue to do so, that I may be His obedient, faithful servant.

Father God, You are gracious, Father, loving and merciful. Reveal to me where I need to change. Continue to rebuke and correct me so I learn to be Your child, Your face to the world, Jesus with skin on. Train me in righteousness and equip me for every good work. Amen.
