Pastor's Corner



- Happy New Year! We begin our new church year today: Advent Sunday as we start our count down to Christmas. In the sermon over the next 4 weeks we are considering the 4 "Be's": Be ready, Be repentant, Be open and Be amazed.
- Today we shall consider how we can be ready while getting on with life. We are considering the Gospel reading, in particular verse 44 You also must be ready all the time. For the Son of Man will come when least expected. We will take up the three images Jesus gives in the Gospel reading this morning namely, Noah, people at work, the thief and to see what He means.
- In this coming year (The "year of Matthew"- series A in our 3 year lectionary) we shall often be using the "**Visual Bible**" for our Gospel readings.
- Welcome to our chaplain (officially "Christian Pastoral Support Worker") at Wynn Vale Primary School, **Cynthia Harbinson** who will be speaking to us at our morning service and we shall be praying for her in her important role.
- In the **confirmation session** we are still looking at the 10 commandments, but as well as this Luther and what it means to be Lutheran.
- What do you think of a "Sunday School" during the morning worship time possibly during the time of the sermon, in the foyer, with a roster of helpers, so parents can get more out of the sermon? The idea has been put to me and a few people I have spoken to about it seem to think it's a good idea. Talk to me about it.
- Someone put it to me that I have suggested a lot of new things in the congregation since I have come. This got me thinking. Many of those actually came from the congregation and I just presented them. For example: Healing Services: from the worship team taking up what Gill Stevenson had been leading a few years ago; Open Forum to discuss our confirmation ministry from the confirmation team; Holy Communion at our Friday morning worship - a member of the congregation; Pastoral Carers - from the constitutions committee I think; "Season of Creation" in September next year from the worship team; "Blessed to serve": worship training opportunity - from worship team; "Gathering of Small Group leaders" from the ministry team; hospital visiting at Modbury from TTG church; "Welcome Sheets" - I believe we had them in the past; even the themes for many sermons from the worship team and others. I could go on... I am sorry that I gave the impression this all came from me. It goes to show that there are many good ideas in the congregation.
- I listed in last week's Pastor's Corner about the **Plan for 2008**: "Growing through involvement." If you would like a calendar of next year's activities, especially if you are leading a group and would like to coordinate your activities with the rest of the church and school, please see me.
- One suggestion we had for next year is "Introducing God". Giving it some more study it appears that it might be a little too difficult to get this running in first term as we had planned. So in it's stead we are running a 4 week series on what is the Christian faith? This will be run on Thursdays in the first school term (ie 21/2/08, 28/2/08, 6/3/08, 13/3/08)
