## Living Hope, Life and Peace in Christ

1 Peter 1: 3 – 5 are some of my favourite verses in the Bible. Peter summarises so many elements of our faith so beautifully in this passage. Peter here gives us a wonderful description of what the living hope and life and peace in Christ means. He summarises Jesus' life, death and resurrection and its meaning for us.

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,

1 Peter 1:3

Peter commences on a note of praise to God – because the hope we rejoice in as Christians is founded in God's salvation which comes through Jesus. It is a living hope that enables the recipients of the letter – in Peter's time Christians scattered

throughout northern Asia Minor – and now us – to persevere and rejoice despite the prospect of future suffering.

Peter doesn't ease our burden by saying: "when things are tough, don't worry about others, take care of yourself." Peter suggests that the tougher the times the greater the need to live a life of love for others. He doesn't lighten our load by saying we don't have to live like Jesus in hard times, but rather writes to give us the power to love.

Peter also emphasises our dependence as Christians on God's initiative to our salvation. It is not earned but directly arises from the grace of God. Thus we receive a new life which is possessed as a living hope. The coming of Christ is a matter of complete confidence. Peter calls our Christian hope - "living hope." because it is based on the resurrection, showing that Christ's work is complete and highlighting that we receive both the word and the assurance that it is true.

and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. This inheritance is kept in heaven for you, 1 Peter 1: 4

Through the resurrection God has given new birth into a living hope that can't perish, spoil, fade; and is kept in heaven for us until the coming of salvation. It will last forever. Our inheritance already belongs to us, one day in heaven we will collect it, and so the difficulties of this life diminish in the face of it.

who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time.

1 Peter 1: 5

God's power is stronger than all of the forces currently lined up against Christians and will shield us like in Romans 8 until the final full revelation of our salvation. Through faith we will be shielded. Peter saw Jesus and loved him. It doesn't surprise him that the Gentiles who didn't, also know him and love him. He expects them to. He understands that it is about receiving the Spirit. He talks in the present tense – you are – we have faith in him and love him now, we strive to live a life reflective of the fruits of the Spirit, as we already know the joy we will experience when we see Him.

## Worship Team - Behind the Scenes

The worship team is made up of 7 congregational members who bring different skills, but a common interest in worship. We meet every 4 - 6 weeks, depending on the season of the church year and the amount of planning needed for upcoming services.

Each meeting begins with a Bible reading and meditation on the place of worship in our faith journey, led by Pastor Greg. We then have a time reflecting on recent services, considering what went well, and where improvements could be made.

Most of the meeting is devoted to discussion and planning for the worship services coming up in the next month, or so. Ideas about the worship form, what elements of the service (such as dramas and visual presentations) need to be planned, and planning for special events, such as baptisms, are discussed. The creativity of the team comes to the fore during these discussions and has led to the establishment of some wonderful new traditions, such as having coffee and Christmas tree decorating on the 4th Sunday in Advent. It also results in the Christmas play and moving Easter worship.

We are blessed to have a wealth of talented people that the team can call on to be involved in creating visual displays, taking part in dramas, helping to make the Christmas gifts given out after the Christmas play and so on.

A review of Salt Factory Worship and the Children's Ministry also occurs at every meeting. Other business is then discussed, which over the past three years has mainly involved in planning how we could continue worship during COVID restrictions. Again, we have been so richly blessed to have members with the knowledge and ability to make our online services happen.

The team welcomes new members, as new ideas and inspirations are always appreciated.
