TWO MINUTES

Romans 5:1-11 says, in part, that "we boast in the hope of the glory of God. Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings" and goes on to explain how suffering produces perseverance which produces character which produces hope.

Now who in their right mind would celebrate or thank God for their sufferings? I can certainly admit that I never thought it possible. Yet now I freely thank God for the phenomenal blessings he has brought to us through these 7 months of Josiah's treatment – blessings that would never have been possible without the suffering.

We regularly receive the comments "I don't know how you do it", "How do you cope with the stress? – you all must be so strong". Well let me tell you – there are no pillars of strength in our household, no superhuman beings that can boast of their resilience as they power through one challenge and setback after another!

But there is hope in the glory of God, and of that we can boast – not of how we deserve God's grace and glory through our faithfulness or piousness – quite the contrary! We can only boast of how God rescues us and showers us with His love and generosity as we discover (repeatedly!) and confess to Him our frailty and faithlessness and utter helplessness.

If you're suffering right now and don't know where God is in your life, then please hold this passage dear and read it regularly – God will bring you hope and peace. Let go and let God.

If you know of someone who is suffering then won't you please be bold and comfort them with this passage? Especially verses 1-5. Print it and give it to them, text it to them, ring them and read it to them – whatever works for you. The only way the Holy Spirit can be released to begin its saving and hope-building work is through God's word.

You may never know what a huge impact this small action has on someone's life...but how cool would it be to see them worshipping with you and all the saints when we arrive in the heavenly realm?? Greg Page

Pastor's Corner



- Today we are going to look at *life, love and laughter* as a theme to a study of the fifth (You shall not kill) and sixth (You shall not commit adultery) commandments. Our prayer is "Lord, teach us how to live". This Sunday morning will again feature a testimony. Today it's Paul Napier who will be speaking.
- In **confirmation** today we are using the spiritual discipline of meditation to rediscover God's gift of creation.
- Note School Council meets on Tuesday (26/2/08), Church Working Bee- this Saturday (1/3/08)
- Next Sunday we are having a good look at the seventh commandment (You shall not steal) and considering the whole concept of giving. Next Sunday we have someone speaking to us from a wonderful ministry at Enfield called "The Food Barn". I'm sure you will be fascinated.
- Last Saturday (16/2/08) we held "The Gathering", run by the Ministry Team, hosted by Ivan and Elnora. Thank you to them and to those who attended. One aspect of the gathering was to inquire of God what he was uniquely blessing. The Ministry Team will study what we heard from God. The strongest responses were: our school, the fishing ministry (GGAF) and youth. But other responses were Asaroka, welcoming, Pastor Leon, servanthood, lay ministry in worship, fellowship groups and Sunday School. We have a lot to be thankful for. Someone gave the image of these ministries being threads woven together to make a net to aid us in being "fishers of men." The next step is to go along with what God is doing - not fighting against it; working out strategies to be part of it and pouring our resources into it to take it "to the next level". That is the challenge.
- The course: What DO you believe? has started this last week. This coming week we are looking at God's gift of prayer. Even if you didn't attend last week, you are welcome to attend one of the sessions (Thursday 1.30pm or Thursday 7.30pm).
- Have you booked into the "Get Real" Conference with Michael Foss on 18, 19 April? See brochures and poster. I reckon it's going to be top notch. For the early bird fee you need to enroll this week.
- Band leaders: I have spoken to a few of you when I have thought of it. But keep in mind not to pick too many new tunes for a service. One new song a week is quite sufficient- even if it has an easy tune. People come to church to worship (I'm told) and they can worship best if they can sing the songs. (I would rather have all well known tunes than songs that fit "perfectly with the theme". Yes fitting in with the theme/s of the day is important, but not as important as being able to sing the songs well.) What do you think?



The role of bishops and presidents in the church is a critical question in ecumenical affairs at present. In this statement we outline the way in which each tradition understands this ministry, and we work towards a common understanding.
