TWO MINUTES

Ezekiel 37:10-14 So I prophesied as I had been told. Breath entered the bodies, and they came to life and stood up. There were enough of them to form an army. God said to me, "Mortal man, the people of Israel are like these bones. They say that they are dried up, without any hope and with no future. So prophesy to my people Israel and tell them that I, the Sovereign Lord, am going to open their graves. I am going to take them out and bring them back to the land of Israel. When I open the graves where my people are buried and bring them out, they will know that I am the Lord. I will put my breath in them, bring them back to life, and let them live in their own land. Then they will know that I am the Lord. I have promised that I would do this—and I will. I, the Lord, have spoken."

The Israelites had turned their backs on God for many years and were now suffering the consequences. Many were killed and most were captured and taken to a life of suffering in Babylon. They were starting to think there was no hope. And even though God had instigated their punishment, he now used Ezekiel again to prophesy to his people. But this time instead of a message of doom and gloom, he gives Ezekiel a message of hope for the Israelites. He breathes life into a pile of old bones to demonstrate that he will eventually breathe a new life into the Israelites and bring them back to their homeland.

Ezekiel's message is also a great message of hope for us when we are feeling down. No matter what our problem, God promises to breathe new life into us – if he can bring a pile of old bones back to life what could he do with us! His ultimate promise is to give us a totally new life with him in his eternal home.

Prayer: Thank you God for being so patient and loving with us. Even though we continually turn our backs on you, you continue to love us and promise us a new life forever with you. Thank you for that hope you have given us. Amen

Pastor's Corner



- Aren't there some people that after you have been with them, you feel so much better? You feel at peace. What is that quality? Do you have it? This is what we are speaking about in the address this morning as we continue to pray: "Lord, teach us how to live". We'll consider that what we say actually comes from the heart as we look at the eighth commandment, "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour", as well as the way Joseph and David and Jesus himself spoke.
- Thank you for all those who filled in the **welcome sheets** last week. I had a long time in prayer from these and they had a strong influence on what I did early in the week. Please fill in them again this morning & evening.
- The Ministry Team is planning to offer a **SERIES OF ELEC-TIVES** on Wednesday evenings in May: a three week series on **Spirituality**, **Parenting and Relationships**. (The thought is that you choose one of these electives and attend the 3 sessions on that particular elective). But the team has a couple of questions: Are you interested and available in coming along to these? Could you please indicate on the "Welcome Sheet" today that you are, by writing "*Elective YES*" and either "*Spirituality*", "*Parenting*" or "*Relationships*". We'll be asking for a response over the next few weeks. Depending on your response we may not run some or any of these electives.
- Thank you to all those who have given testimonies during Lent with this sermon series: Chris Hahn, Michael Gower, Paul Napier and today Julie Hahn and thank you to Daniel Bartel for his heartfelt presentation last Sunday. I've had very positive responses from all of these.
- Also isn't it wonderful what God is doing through the Enfield Community Food Service (what I have called the "Food Barn". Maurice Clark and Neville Mibus gave a succinct presentation last Sunday that, I believe, touched a lot of people. If you want to know about it see Judith. She has information at Church Admin.
- I am looking forward to hearing from Natalie and her team today as they speak about **H.A.N.D.S** : health and education for East Timor.
- In **confirmation** today we are looking at who Jesus is. We are studying Jesus and his life according to the Gospel of John, using our Bibles and the DVD by the same name.
- We continue the course: What DO you believe? by looking a our Christian life: giving, serving, witnessing. This is the last in the series. Still come if you haven't been to any of the others: Thurs 1.30pm or 7.30pm.
- This week: Management team (Tuesday), opening of Endeavour Centre; Sunday 2pm.
- Next Sunday morning: Palm Sunday is a "Family Service". Family Services (which used to be called "School Sundays") are now being run by some of the classes from our school. Expect a very different worship experience - one that is aimed at children - and the children in us. We'll be finishing our sermon series with the 9th and 10th commandments but also taking up the theme of Palm Sunday: Get ready for Jesus in our lives. (As the people welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem on that first Palm Sunday, we welcome him in so that we are ready for the Easter weekend: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday.)
- Speaking of Easter. The theme for Easter is "Care". Maundy Thursday: Care for community, Good Friday: Care for ourselves, Easter: Care for wider community. A few more notes: Maundy Thursday is being run by the Salt Factory Team so there should be a few innovations. We are planning to use "The Gospel of John" DVD for some of the readings. Easter dawn service 6.15am at the Schmocker's. Hot Cross buns breakfast at the church plant at 8.45 am prior to the main service.


