TWO MINUTES

Isaiah 50 v 4

"The Sovereign Lord has given me an instructed tongue, to know that the word sustains the weary. He wakens my ear to listen like one being taught"

This verse stuck out immediately to me. The biggest struggle that I have in my walk with God is stopping and spending quiet time with Him. We have demanding jobs, a family that we don't spend enough time with, study to complete, committee's to be on, a household to run, investments to make, a little recreation wherever possible, and so on it goes. By the time you get some peace and quiet all you want to do is close your eyes and hit the pillow.

This verse says that 'God's word sustains the weary'. I don't think that having daily time with God is going to be easy. Just like as a parent it is not easy to get up in the middle of the night to a crying child, or get home from work dog tired to cook tea, bath kids and clean up. It can be a slog. But it is our devotion to our kids (and other loved ones) that keeps us going. It is this sort of love that deepens our relationships and gives us the warm and fuzzy stuff later on.

In the same way we honour God by our willingness to spend time with Him when sometimes we are too tired, too busy, or too lazy. Just like our relationships on earth, they take work – but the fruits of your work are very sweet.

Once we are there in our 1 on 1 time God is saying that he will wake us up and open our ears to what he has to say. He will energize us. Have I digressed?..... maybe.... But Heavenly Father I pray that we know your word, that it may sustain us when we are weary, and waken our ears to hear you even though sometimes it is hard....Amen

- The picture for Palm Sunday is Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a donkey. A picture of humility and a picture of peace. Where did that peace come from? How can we have that peace amidst the clamor of our life? Today we finish our sermon series on the 10 commandments: "Lord, teach us how to live". Copies of the 7 sermons in this series available at the door this morning or the front desk (church admin.) during the week.




