TWO MINUTES

He calls His own sheep by name and leads them out— John 10:3b

The sheep-herding practice of the Palestinian shepherd, leading from the front and calling the sheep to follow, is foreign to Aussies used to seeing the farmer drive the sheep from behind, ensconced in his vehicle and whistling up his dogs. In Jesus' time, the shepherd lived out in the fields with the sheep, fending off the wild animals, building an open-roofed, walled enclosure to protect from the elements and even sleeping across the doorway as a gate to keep sheep from wandering off. It was a much more intimate relationship. The shepherd knew his sheep, he lived with them, he named them, he called them; they recognised his voice and followed. The shepherd only called those sheep that belonged to him. If the sheep heard another shepherd call, they would not follow because they did not recognise the voice.

Jesus wants to have a trusting, intimate relationship with us, as a shepherd to his sheep. He wants us to know Him so well that we hear His voice, we recognise Him as our Saviour Shepherd and we follow where He leads. May you stay tuned to His voice, listen for His call and then having heard, follow.

Loving Shepherd, ever near, Teach your lamb your voice to hear Suffer not my steps to stray, From the straight and narrow way. Amen.
