Pastor's Column

This morning I have pleasure in welcoming Mike
Leske who will be speaking to us on the topic of community. Consequently, I shall be presenting a shorter address. It will be on the theme of "The Lord so close", based on a verse from the first reading for today: Acts

17:27 "His purpose in all of this was that the nations should seek after God and perhaps feel their way toward him and find him—though he is not far from any one of us." The full sermon is available at the door and on our web page and I will preach at Salt Factory tonight.

- Over these weeks I have been presenting what I see as **what we value at GGLF**. I have chosen to keep it to 5 core values. I have only presented those that are important and somewhat unique to Golden Grove Lutheran Fellowship. When we came up with the core values initially, we included: God's inspired Word and the gift of faith, that God wants all people to be saved and that God has gifted every Christian for service but I take these as given for all Churches. I could have included inclusivity, communication and working with other churches and even though they are important I don't believe they are as highly valued as these five.
- So for the fifth value...

We value our Youth with their enthusiasm, initiative and boldness. The young people of our congregation are an integral part of our congregation. We cater for their particular needs with a Youth Team Leader, CCs, Step Up to Communion, Rev320, Bakery and Salt Factory. But we also look for opportunities to fellowship and worship together. Salt Factory dinner and worship is our main venue for this. The Youth help keep our congregation enthusiastic, with initiative and boldness. At Salt Factory ("worship run by the Youth for the whole congregation") the Youth can experiment different worship approaches and use their gifts to grow in their relationship with God.

- Confirmation session today is on the topic of The Fruit of the Spirit, witnessing and serving. The next time we meet is a "Day Camp" (next Saturday in the church/school plant) in which the young people will be prepared for the day of their confirmation. Next Sunday is their rehearsal and the day of confirmation is planned for 18th May.
- Next Step/Confirmation 2008/2009 meeting for young people and their parents/guardians to work out the structure of the course: Wednesday 7th May with the thought that confirmation sessions would start at the beginning of 3rd Term with Alyssa leading the first term.
- Please note when Alyssa and her team is running "Step Up to Communion" this term.
- This week our School starts second term with a Holy Communion service tomorrow. You are welcome to join us. I shall be attending a Lutheran Education Association (LEA) Visioning workshop on Tuesday morning. We have our School Council meeting Tuesday evening and since I am on the Ardtornish Primary School committee to appoint a CPSW (chaplain) the meeting to achieve this will take up much of the next two Fridays.
- **Next Sunday** we have 2 baptisms: Nathan and Justin Dunn. Nathan is a student at our school, parents: Belinda and Steven. It is also our AGMs: church and school. Also God will ing, Amy Vogt will be taking her **Next Step** (at her home.)
- For your information: I will be taking my Rest and Recu peration Leave (alias Long Service Leave, formally Recuperation Leave) from 19th May to 17th August, which starts in 3 week's time, but whose counting? (See my article in the up coming "Life in the Vine")


