TWO MINUTES

To Live in Christ, we first died with Christ! Romans 6:1-11

Isn't it wonderful to know that our sins died with Christ on the cross and that we received our new life through his resurrection.

Romans 6:4 says 'we were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.'

What have we done to deserve this new life......NOTHING!

It is by God's grace, through faith, that we have been saved. It is because of God's unconditional love for us that we are no longer slaves to sin. 
