TWO MINUTES

Isaiah 55 verses 1-5 "Come, buy, eat."

I like invitations. It is nice when you are included in something, especially if there is a meal involved! Sometimes a store will invite you to 'come and buy' at a special sale. So God's invitation to, "Come, buy, eat" is Ok, something we are sort of familiar with . . . until the next line, that says, "You, who have no money"! Hey – what?

If this message is for everyone then it can't be talking about buying with earthly treasures because only the very poorest have nothing to spend or trade.

My guess is that God is telling us that none of us has any legal 'heavenly tender' to use.

No money! Buy with no money? What will I pay with if I have no heavenly tender? What can I 'exchange' except my nakedness, thirst and poverty? I have nothing fit for heaven. That is exactly the 'exchange' God is willing to make. Come with that and God provides abundantly. All His goodness, all His bounty in exchange for our emptiness. Water for the thirsty, wine and milk for those without. Bread to satisfy. Life for the soul, the richest bounty ever. Unconventional? Unreal? Awesome!



(from SA Council of Churches)

Gospel

When Jesus heard of the death of John the Baptist, he withdrew in a boat to a deserted place by himself. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns. When he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them and cured their sick.

When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for themselves."

Jesus said to them, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat."

They replied, "We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish."

And he said, "Bring them here to me."

Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full. And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children. *Matthew* 14:13-21

For reflection...

Over and above personal problems, there is an objective challenge to overcome inequity, injustice, helplessness, suffering, carelessness, oppression. Over and above the din of desires there is a calling, a demanding, a waiting, and an expectation. There is a question that follows me wherever I turn. What is expected of me? What is demanded of me? What we encounter is not only flowers and stars, mountains and walls. Over and above all things is a sublime expectation, a waiting for. With every child born a new expectation enters the world.

This is the most important experience in the life of every human being: something is asked of me. Every human being has had a moment in which they sensed a mysterious waiting for them. Meaning is found in responding to the demand, meaning is found in sensing the demand.
