TWO MINUTES

Yes, we are saved!

Romans 10:9 *If you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.*

The NIV Study Bible states that the words "Jesus is Lord" is the earliest Christian confession of faith. We can confess too, along with the early Christians of the first century and Christians across the ages, that Jesus is Lord. What a joy it is to proclaim that Jesus, born in Bethlehem some 2000 years ago, is the Christ, the only Son of the Father. And we believe that not only did Jesus live on this earth, but he also still lives.

The text above gives us such reassurance. When we are burdened by our shortcomings and our failures, when we are racked by self-doubt and misgivings, we can know with simple clarity that it is nothing that we do (or fail to do) that contributes to our salvation. We are assured here that our simple confession and our personal belief in Jesus who saves, means that **yes, we are saved!**

Prayer: *Dear Father, we thank and praise you for your plan of salvation. We are assured of our salvation through your Son Jesus. Help us to be bold in confessing that "Jesus is Lord." Amen.*

NEW BANNERS

The Olive Branch: Hope and Peace

We are told Noah sent out a dove from the ark. Then we read: "the dove came back to him ... and lo, in her mouth a freshly plucked olive leaf; so Noah knew the waters had subsided." With this sign of hope, the human race could make its second start.

The olive branch is best known as a symbol of peace. Readiness to forgive and to make peace is a Christian virtue, Stemming from the peace we have with God in Christ Jesus.

The black and white cockatoos extend to each other an olive branch, the symbol of hope and peace.

The cockatoo banners depict the story of the white and black cockatoos. The original banner was created by Pastor George Rosendale and hangs in the church at Hope Vale, Queensland. Our representation has been created with permission.

The White and Black Cockatoo Story

The black and white cockatoos were brothers. The white cockatoo was the eldest, and the black cockatoo was the youngest. One day the white cockatoo found his brother sitting under a shady tree looking sad and angry.

He asked him, 'What is wrong with you, brother?'


He answered, 'I'm angry with our Father, because he made you white and me black. I don't like it. I'm going to change myself. I want to be like you.'

So one day he went to his uncle, who lived over the range, and asked him for honey and clay. 'Take as much as you like, boy', said his uncle. He got the honey and clay and went back. He took the clay and made it into powder. He rubbed honey all over himself and then sprinkled the powder over his body. He looked at himself and was quite happy. He said to himself, 'Now I look like my brother'.

His grandfather saw him and got angry with him. He said, 'You are a silly boy. You shouldn't have done that stupid thing.' He called to the North Wind to send rain. The monsoons came and it rained and rained and rained, and washed all the honey and clay off him.

He found that nothing changed. So he went back to his shady tree and sat down planning what to do next. His brother found him sitting under the tree, angry, sad and sorry. He said to him, 'Why are you doing this foolish thing to hurt our Father? We are his sons. He loves both of us. He made us and he loves you just as much as he loves me. You should be happy and singing, knowing that Father loves you so much.'

So to this day the black cockatoo is singing when he is feeding and flying.
