Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. 2 Corinthians 9:7-8

"The opposite of good is not evil, the opposite of good is indifference." – Abraham Joshua Heschel


This quote has always been one that resonates with me. For me it perfectly explains the idea that just because you're not the cause of a problem, doesn't mean you shouldn't be part of the solution. I think everyone at one point in their lives has been faced with a challenge that they'd just rather ignore – that they'd rather not think, speak or even look at - because it's far easier to do nothing when we don't acknowledged the problem in the first place, than when we look at it up close, face to face, and see it for what it really is. The issue of refugees (or displaced individuals) is one of those "problems", that many people brush-off or ignore on the same premise - "it's really not my business not my problem, not my job". But that's not true, and we know it. I often think about what my life would be like if even one aspect of it was different. If I'd been born in a different country, had different family / parents, different friends or even a different school. So many of these things have been decided for me, completely out of my control, and in my case they've worked out for the best, but for others (at no fault of their own) things have left them in a much worse situation. I don't know why I have all that I have, and someone just like me who is only on the other side of the ocean doesn't; but I do know that I will do anything I can to make sure that that person is given the same opportunities that I, and others, so easily take for granted.
