MAINLY MUSIC NEWS— G'day

Father's Day ... somewhere in regional Australia ... this group celebrated. This is worth making a hot drink before you starting reading because it's totally inspirational. This will remind you that God is incredibly great. This is just ONE group attempting to connect with many families.

One mum and her two children have been back every week since they were considering a huge decision in their lives. On Saturday we held a 'Dad Friendly Saturday session'. The mum came with children and grandparents. The grandma was saying how important the group seems to the mum. Another side of the story is that the church had been looking for ways to try and build connections with the mainly music families. Two team members have really connected with this family - building those connections and feeling like they, on behalf of the church, have something to offer them - hope and love.

Another mum's second baby was due last week. The day before, a close family member died. The mum was able to attend the funeral and deal with all the family emotions. She came on to the Father's Day event with her husband. The baby hasn't yet come but emotionally, she now feels ready to meet her new baby. We'd all written a card for her and had a chat.

At the Father's Day event, I stopped the session and everyone got out their camera because a little child was taking his first ever steps! The whole group stopped – we were able to share in a really brilliant moment. The mum and dad were both nearly crying!

Ten families (most with both parents and grandparents) came for the Father's Day event. The church had been thinking of ways to connect so the minister came too and was blown away with the day. We had paper plane flying competitions with huge amounts of laughter and lots of conversations. We can build the links between mainly music and the church - it is possible and we have begun!

The older grandmothers of the church have invited a few of the families to join with them to take afternoon tea to the local retirement village and hospital. I'm really looking forward to hear how it goes. I can't go but I don't need too - the church is taking the lead and others from the team are going - the mainly music is now a church mechanism not just my vision - excellent.

Don't you LOVE this! Many people ... many connections ... much focus on the connection between church and community. Delightful.
