Pastor's Column

Welcome to our worship today. I have a question for you: *How do you respond to God?* It depends very much on how you see God, doesn't it? If you see him as the Judge then perhaps you might be frightened of him, you might be trying to appease him; if you see him as a senile old Grandfather then you might try to humour him and do good when you feel as though he is watching; if you see him as the great Teacher you might respond to him as the way you had responded to your teachers in he past; both in a positive and negative way! So..... how do you see God and so how do you respond to God?

From the title of today's address: **"The life of worship**" you can see what I am thinking of as an appropriate response. And it comes from the how he presents himself to us in the book of Romans. But this begs the question, *What is worship to you*? I am going to expand on Romans 12:1, 2 this morning (from the second reading for today): as transformation not conformation, trusting in God and having a new way of living. Can you see yourself as responding to God – worshipping like this?

This evening I am taking up **Job 1-3** (the reading for the ONE YEAR BIBLE for today) to consider the issue of suffering. How is Satan involved in the suffering in the world? How are we to respond to suffering? Can anything good ever come from suffering?

The next big event for us at Golden Grove Lutheran fellowship is the series "**On the wings of an eagle**", based on Isaiah 40:28-31. The worship team is putting a lot of effort into making worship in September truly memorable. We have a special banner lined up, theme songs, a guest preacher in the third week and a celebration in the fourth....

Mainly Music now meeting on Tuesdays at 9.00 am (8.45 am for new registrations) and held in the GGLF Worship Centre. Cost \$5 per family. Come 'n' try first session free

The main emphasis of Mainly Music is connection between church and community, where the wider church connects with families from our Mainly Music program on a Tuesday morning.

Some additional connection points

All the connections we have link together through Jesus; everything our church at Golden Grove does is done to the glory of God. Our Mainly Music families could connect with our church in several different ways; Mainly Music may be the initial contact point if members from the Church were able to join us for the morning coffee. Mainly Music has drawn a number of young families together, but we only have a few members of GGLF helping to run Mainly Music.

Other churches write about their connections with families through Mainly Music: "We initially started a four wheel drive group, as many of the dads in our church community had 4WDs. This ran for a couple of years on a semi regular basis, and really helped us connect with Mainly Music families, not just the mums and kids. Through this, many families started coming to church. The four wheel driving has now become the MOBsters (Men on bikes). This group has provided a great way of connecting with some of our Mainly Music dads, and also with some other males in our local community."

"The best way we've connected regularly with Mainly Music families is through inviting them to our church Community Dinners. In January, we did a different style of church to help create connections with the families. We met each Sunday at the hall at the usual time, but did different activities during and after church, such as a pancake brunch, went berry picking, went on a family bike ride etc. We were able to connect with several families, who wouldn't normally come to church."
