

TWO MINUTES

Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), said, "Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor?" (He said this not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) Jesus said, "Leave her alone. She bought it so that she might keep it for the day of my burial. You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me." John 12: 3-7

For Reflection...

If this woman had gone to Jesus's grave with this outpouring of affection and perfume, it would have been accepted, even admired. You were allowed to anoint a dead body, but it was not acceptable to express similar love and affection to a live one. Nothing has changed in two thousand years. We still save our best compliments and flowers for the

funeral. Jesus's challenge here is for us to anoint each other while we are still alive: shower those you love with affection and flowers while they are alive... Ronald Rolheiser 'Seeking Spirituality'

Pastor's Column

Today we are looking at the question: "*What are we doing for the poor*", based on the Gospel reading for the day, in particular John 12:5 "*Why wasn't this perfume sold and the money given to the poor? It was worth a year's wages.* It's another of the "tough questions" that have been levelled at the church. How would you answer this question? We'll look at Vincent de Paul's approach and we'll struggle with what we as individuals and as a congregation can do for the poor.

Also today we are concluding our program **Bibles for persecuted Christians.** This program focuses special attention on our courageous persecuted brothers and sisters in Christ. So we shall be dedicating our boxes in a special Bible offering ceremony.

This afternoon is the **CPSW commissioning Service** at Pedare, 2.30pm. Come along to what proved to be a most inspiring service last year, hear what our 12 Christian Pastoral Support Workers (CPSWs= our chaplains in public schools) are doing and show your support for them by being present. Pastor Peter Steicke is the occasional preacher.

This coming Wednesday in our half hour **LENTEN DEVOTION** we are looking at Psalm 67. Why don't you come along? It's the last in our series.

We have another **Ministry Of Care** meeting this week. These meetings are run by the Pastoral Carers and are for anyone who would like to be supported and encouraged in their care of others.

The Friends of Asaroka meeting this week is likewise for anyone who would like to know about Asaroka, what's happening in our ministry with the schools there and would perhaps like to get more involved.

This Friday and Saturday we shall take the *first leg* of the new confirmation course: *Journey.* It is at the Schutz's place and the theme is map and compass (the Bible)

Also next weekend is our **School family Service** in the morning and **Step up to Communion** (First communion) which will include **3 baptisms**!

This means that Easter is only 2 weeks away! Invite your friends to worship over Easter- especially those you have been praying for on your Focused Prayer List.

Today I would like to draw your attention to **Maundy Thursday**: the theme for the service is Confidence from Holy Communion. It is run by the Salt Factory team and I am sure there will be many innovative expressions of worship in this service. (Remember how last year we wrote our prayers on the table cloths which we used in the prayer room over the weekend.)

Don't forget as I said last week, at the Easter **Dawn Service** this year I am encouraging people to give a short testimony (*your story* as we have termed it in "*Creating Confidence to Share your faith*"): how God has touched you in a special way. In the last few weeks I have picked up that there are some wonderful stories around by hearing the "I believe statements" of the confirmees, in talking to people about baptisms and about people growing in their faith. Please let me know if you would like share your story at the Dawn Service.

Are you interested in the evening: **What is baptism and what does it mean for me?**: a pastor led evening: Tuesday 30th March, to learn about and discuss baptism? Please note this evening will go ahead only if people indicate an interest to me about attending.

Logos - Evening Sessions - Starting TONIGHT at 8:00pm - 9:30pm

Over the last few weeks we have been running a course on Sunday mornings called Logos. It is all about what Christians believe and why they believe it. It covers those obscure or difficult questions like where did angels and demons come from?, how Jesus can be a man and yet be God?, and who wrote the Bible?

There have been a number of people who have said they would like to come to Logos but can't make Sunday mornings. In response we have decided to start up a second stream of Logos session on Sunday Evenings.

Part 1 is being running during terms 1 and 2 this year on Sunday evenings after the Salt Factory service. It is a 7 week course which asks the question, who is God and what is He like? Topics such as the doctrine of the Trinity, who wrote the Bible, and the nature of good and evil are discussed.
