TWO MINUTES

Luke 8: 26-39

This passage of scripture deals with the healing of a demon possessed man. What is Jesus teaching us in this passage? Well at least two points come to mind. Firstly Jesus used His gift of healing by commanding the evil spirits to come out of this man. This power of healing is a gift from God and scripture teaches us that this gift has been given to the body of Christ for use in the church. Do you have the gift of healing and don't realise it? When was the last time you prayed for healing, believing God would heal that person? I encourage you to step out in faith and ask God for this gift and practice using it.

The second point is in verse 39. The man Jesus healed wanted to go with Jesus, but Jesus sent him away saying, 'return home and tell how much God has done for you.' This message is again a reminder for all of us, to tell others what God has done in our lives. Do we often take for granted what happens in our lives or do we see God's hand moving and don't give him the praise or tell others of how God has intervened in our life. As Pastor Leon has mentioned many times, we should have many stories of how God has moved in our lives each week, if we are open to God working in our lives each day.

May God's Holy Spirit enlighten your life, so you see His hand moving and give glory to His name. Amen

Pastor's Column

Today we continue looking at the Gospel readings with Luke 8 in particular **Luke 8:37, 38**: Then all the people of the region of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave them, because they were overcome with fear. So he got into the boat and left. The man from whom the demons had gone out begged to go with him, but Jesus sent him away. The address will be on **prayer as a response.** We'll consider recognizing, responding well and being receptive to God.

Welcome to **Cynthia Harbinson**, **our CPSW at Wynn Vale Primary School**. We look forward to your presentation of the children's address this morning. Thank you for the report of all the wonderful things that are happening at Wynn Vale Primary School.

I mentioned last Sunday that we had a *church*/ *school partnership morning* this week. Neville Grieger led 14 of us from 6 different school/church relationships in our north/north-eastern region in a paper he had written entitled 'School the "new church". It affirmed what we are doing here at Golden Grove, stressed the importance of personal relationships and encouraged integrity in what we do. I felt that we need to work on our entry points from the school community into discipleship in the congregation, that we make too many assumptions and that we need to have higher expectations of people in this faith journey. I am happy to talk about any of this with you.

During this month as we are considering how we grow in faith-through prayer, I am encouraging you to **give** your story of how God has answered your prayers. So please pray about standing up one Sunday and sharing this with the congregation. It may be a dramatic answer to prayer or a simple way God moved, something that changed your life or changed the moment, something you have shared widely or not at all, recent or in the distant past. As I announced last Sunday, let me know during a song if something comes to mind and we will give you an opportunity to speak straight after that song. (Remember to keep it short.)
