TWO MINUTES

The Ten Commandments - Exodus 20: 1-17.

Do you ever wonder why we live in a society full of laws, rules and regulations? Wouldn't it be so much easier to do what we like, when we like, and how we like? Why do we set boundaries for our children?

There are definitely obvious reasons why we have the following rules and regulations:

Don't drink and drive.

Don't exceed the speed limit.

Childproof fence around backyard swimming pools.

Specific times for watering our gardens.

Why do we have these rules when they are forever being disobeyed? Maybe because we humans are not perfect and

it doesn't matter how hard we try we never will be.

I wonder why God gave us the Ten Commandments and what he thinks when we break them?

He gave them to us to set some boundaries for our lives and make us strive to keep them. Yes, He knew it would be impossible for us to obey them because his standards are so high and they are impossible for us to keep and that's why He died on the cross for us.

But why give them to us in the first place if He knew we would fail?

If we look closely, we'll see that the commandments are based on a simple, positive foundation of love. All of us would rather hear about what we **can do** rather than what we are **forbidden** to do. As we examine the Ten Commandments they reveal that God's message contains more what "to do" than "not to do" items.

The Ten Commandments teach us how to first love God, and then love our neighbor. When God is first in our lives, the rest comes naturally.

Danny Guglielmucci, the pastor of the Edge church, previously Southside AOG, in this very short book (105 pages) in answering this question gives a vision of what he sees the Church should be doing during the week.

Pastor Danny speaks on "Repositioning the Church" and then what the Sunday-Monday Church would look like: working

together, how they began, their journey and ours, then what kind of Church do we need become and changing the atmosphere of our congregation.

His vision is what has led to the involvement of a number of congregations in refurbishing Adelaide's Women's & Children's Hospital, which you might have heard about on the news: "mobilizing 377 volunteers from the Christian churches of Adelaide...our community has been blessed and the Church made visible once more" (p. 104) to helping a family that had fallen on hard times (pp 73-75) as well as a few other pertinent stories.

I feel that his message is most relevant to us who are considering our vision here. A good read, available from our library. Pastor Leon
