

TWO MINUTES

Acts 4:12 "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name given under heaven by which we must be saved."

At first look at this verse I have a tendency to focus on the first few words, and it isn't too difficult to compare Jesus' power to the rest of the world. However, it is the other section of the verse which grabbed my attention.

I am reminded of the second commandment "You must not misuse the name of the Lord your God." A key component to this commandment is that the Lord's name is holy. Additionally though, the Lord's name is powerful. You can see his power in the way his name affects people. How his name is inspiration to many wonderful ideas and beliefs. Not to mention that the words "In the name of Jesus Christ" is often the beginning of many spiritual acts.

Going back to the Acts verse, you could substitute the word 'name' for the word 'power', and I don't think the meaning of the verse changes at all. So then, we are given clear direction that if we want salvation from the grasp of sin and death, we know which power to turn to.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, thank you for showing us your love, and using your power to conquer sin and death. In your holy name we pray. Amen.

Pastor's Column

This morning we are continuing to ask the question of Scripture (2 Corinthians) "Where is God when we are struggling?" We shall discover that he is sending us. So, what does that mean for us? God ordains and equips us in ministry. When we struggle over our competency we can be assured that it is in fact God who sends us. The Ministry is of the Gospel, not of the Law. 2 Corinthians 3:5 states: "Not that we are competent in ourselves to claim anything for ourselves, but our competence comes from God."

Last week we celebrated **Paul Swansson's installation** as our Youth Team Leader. I hope you were able to join us.
