TWO MINUTES

Isaiah 6:8 - And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here am I! Send me."

Just before this Isaiah describes a vision that is out of this world and says he is unclean and not worthy of the Lord. God then makes Isaiah clean for His work and Isaiah responds to the Lord saying "Here am I! send me.". We are daily, through prayer and confession, made clean before God. Christ's sacrifice has made this possible, but do we walk out of our homes and say to God "Here I am. Send me."? How many opportunities to share God's love with others do we miss out on? The good news is that the same sacrifice of Christ that daily cleanses us for God's work also cleanses us from our failures, giving us a new start and new opportunities daily to share his love.

Lord help us to say Send Me to every request made by others and see it as an opportunity to share your love. Open us to the truth that what you have so richly provided us with is not ours at all but only a tool for your ministry. Comfort us that you will sustain us and strengthen as we serve you.

I hope you are having a great long weekend. As was mentioned last week the Youth leaders and Bakery are away this weekend at a leadership retreat at Port Pirie.

I struggle when I see people who are desperately poor. Questions come to mind: How are these people being helped? What can I do about all this? How did *this* situation ever come about? And the age old question..... Where is God in all this? Today the theme for our sermon under the general heading of "Where is God when we are struggling? is: God is in the poor, from 2 Corinthians 8:9 For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich. I struggle when I see people who are desperately poor.

Next Sunday is the last in this series. The title is **God is blessing us**, taken from 2 Corinthians 9:8 And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. What a wonderful thought to keep in mind when we are tempted to accuse of God of not being close/ not being interested/ too busy to care that he is in fact blessing us. I am looking forward to presenting this too.
