

### **TWO MINUTES**

Obedience Commanded Deut 4:1-2,6-9

In this passage the command is given to the people of Israel to follow the decrees and laws being given to them, so that they might live and take possession of the land to which they were being led.

They were not to add or subtract to or from them, and in verse 9 they are told to teach them to their children.

God' laws and commands to us are the same Ten Commandments given to Moses.

### Pastor's Column

Welcome to **Brayden Hogben and Kirra Jones** who are being baptized in our School Family Service today. What a great opportunity to be baptized – not only with family and friends but the special faith community of the primary School and Fellowship.

A welcome too to the all the other families of the students who make up the year 2/3 classes of our school. I am looking forward to the "Victory at Sea" and "What's for Lunch?" which will be featured in our worship this morning.

At Salt Factory this evening we are repeating the blessing we gave to the **third team who are going to Asaroka** and again we are hearing about where we have come in our partnership with Asaroka and what this team will be doing.

At Salt Factory I shall be preaching on a wonderful text from the book of Colossians: **Colossians 1:9-12** <sup>9</sup>For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you and asking God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all spiritual wisdom and understanding. <sup>10</sup>And we pray this in order that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and may please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God, <sup>11</sup>being strengthened with all power according to his glorious might so that you may have great endurance and patience, and joyfully <sup>12</sup>giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the kingdom of light .and considering the topic: "The prayer that pleases God." It's a prayer I would pray for you and I would love you to pray for me. I will show you what I mean by this, this evening.

How are you going with your Growth Journal? How often have I asked you that? I have had the feedback that the readings are too long, you have misplaced your Journal, some of you have got out of the habit and others are using a different devotional plan. So I would like to put to you a slight change in direction: "The One Year Bible". It has been around for a few years now. It is a reading plan in which you can read the whole Bible in one year. It takes me about 10 minutes to read each day. I would still encourage you to use SOAP (Scripture: pick one verse from the readings; O: make some observations about it: context, meaning for the time; A: Application- apply to your life and P: Prayer; write out a short prayer.) and that would make it 20 minutes a day but what benefit you would gain! I use my One year Bible to journal in, but you could use an exercise book or your Growth Journals pages. We shall be printing the reading plan for each week in the Bulletin, the whole year is available in printed copy from the church office and you can access it on line from www.oneyearbibleonline.com or you can buy a One Year Bible at a very reasonable price in a number of different versions. (I bought mine in NLT for \$5 from Koorong) I feel it would be so encouraging to be using the same Bible plan - so that it could become part of our conversation with each other and we start every meeting (in devotion) by sharing what we have come up that day from our SOAP journaling based on that reading plan. Why not add it to what you are taking up in Servant September?

Next Sunday we commence "Servant September" As I said last week: Servant September has a number of highlights that you might like to avail yourself of:

- The special Sundays: Time, The Wider Church, Treasures, Talents. Each Sunday I shall be giving you one main *insight, encouragement and challenge* on each of these themes.
- A series of Bible Studies called "Living is Giving" available for Fellowship Groups (see Jon and Leanne Schiller our FG Coordinators.)
- In regard to the letter I mentioned last week in the Bulletin (addressed to people I haven't caught up with in a while) this may mean that I may have to put an apology in for some or all meetings in September in order to visit these people. Remember if you would like me to visit you just let me know why not use the welcome sheets?
- One Year Bible SOAP journaling (see above).

Remember too, we are extending our offer to come to the **Global Leadership Summit** on the 9<sup>th</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> October for \$99. Keep in mind you can come to one day (for half the price). It is well worth while going to. Talk to someone who has been.

### KIDS AT HEART

For our visitors, the Kids at Heart team is a small team of people in our congregation who are keeping our children's needs at heart and remembering that the adults are sometimes kids at heart too. One of our ambitions is to let the kids have some fun at the quiet craft table during the sermon. That way, they have some time with their parents during the morning services, and also a little bit of time to be creative, to wriggle around and to learn about our God and what He means to us through artistic activities, with their friends. One reason that we hold the craft activities in the church building with everyone else is so that the children

never feel separated from their parents, and vice versa, resulting in a feeling of everyone worshipping together. It also resolves some other issues of having enough supervisors who are Childsafe accredited, which would be necessary if the children were taken away from their parent's vision.

To enable these craft activities to occur we enjoy the help of some of the parents to watch over the little ones, especially those learning to use scissors and glue safely. If your child is quite competent at these activities, feel free to leave them at the table with the others whilst you enjoy some listening time yourself. (The helpers do glance around and help most of the children, but we cannot guarantee them all one on one attention for the whole activity. ) We are grateful to several ladies and older children in our fellowship who prepare the craft activities for the enrichment of the little one's worship time. Thank you.

Similarly, we are grateful to the donors of money and craft goodies that we use. (If you have any left over craft materials that you think could be utilised, please leave at the front office. Thank you.)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, The peace of the Lord be with you.

Some of you will be aware, through different means, that an incident occurred at a SA/NT District youth camp earlier this year which has attracted the interest of the media. I wish to inform you that the police have charged some people, and that the first court hearings will take place soon. At that time it is possible that the media will learn more details of what happened, and will be very anxious to get reactions from anyone in the LCA.

I am writing to ask you <u>not</u> to make any comments whatsoever – not even to your local press. Very few people know the facts, and I am asking that, regardless of where you live, you direct all enquiries to the SA/NT District office. Please pray that God will use this difficult time to bring glory to his name, blessing to the church, and comfort to all who are personally impacted by this incident.


