

#### **TWO MINUTES**

#### To everything, there is a season...

Although it was before my time..., I still have heard the song 'Turn, Turn' many times, never realising it came from the bible. In fact it's almost word for word from the Ecclesiastes verse for today. What a fitting verse for the first of our Sundays in 'Servant September' – TIME.

It is interesting to think of life in these ways: a time to be born, a time to die – yeah, that's life; a time to tear down, a time to build – progress, they call this; a time to be silent, a time to speak – how often do we only do one of these? There are also the verses: a time to kill, a time to heal; and, a time for war, a time for peace – interesting the thoughts associated with these events. I personally don't like war and killing, and cannot see the sense in the power struggles that generally cause it, however when you put it into perspective, it is interesting the everyday technology & developments which have come from these elements – e.g. super glue and Kevlar, so maybe there is some good after all.

This is where our other two readings fit in so well. In Matthew, we are reminded that even though the things of this earth will pass away, God himself is timeless – He will never change and His Word will never pass away. Matthew also reminds us that the day and hour of God's return is known only to the Father. So now we need to sit up and take notice of the Ephesians verse – being careful how we live. Throughout all the 'Times' of our life, the good and the bad, the love and the hate, God is still with us, caring for us, waiting for us to praise and thank him for all that he is, does and provides.

Yes, to everything there IS a season, and God is always there waiting for us to 'turn, turn' to him and his timeless love.

How are you going with your Growth Journal? How often have I asked you that? I have had the feedback that the readings are too long, you have misplaced your Journal, some of you have got out of the habit and others are using a different devotional plan. So I would like to put to you a slight change in direction: "The One Year Bible". It has been around for a few years now. It is a reading plan in which you can read the whole Bible in one year. It takes me about 10 minutes to read each day. I would still encourage you to use SOAP (Scripture: pick one verse from the readings; O: make some observations about it: context, meaning for the time; A: Application- apply to your life and P: Prayer; write out a short prayer.) and that would make it 20 minutes a daybut what benefit you would gain! I use my One year Bible to journal in, but you could use an exercise book or your Growth Journal pages. We shall be printing the reading plan for each week in the Bulletin, the whole year is available in printed copy from the church office and you can access it on line from www.oneyearbibleonline.com or you can buy a One Year Bible at a very reasonable price in a number of different versions. (I bought mine in NLT for \$5 from Koorong) I feel it would be so encouraging to be using the same Bible plan - so that it could become part of our conversation with each other and we start every meeting (in devotion) by sharing what we have come up with that day from our SOAP journaling based on that reading plan. Why not add it to what you are taking up in Servant September?

## KIDS AT HEART

For our visitors, the Kids at Heart team is a small team of people in our congregation who are keeping our children's needs at heart and remembering that the adults are sometimes kids at heart too. One of our ambitions is to let the kids have some fun at the quiet craft table during the sermon. That way, they have some time with their parents during the morning services, and also a little bit of time to be creative, to wriggle around and to learn about our God and what He means to us through artistic activities, with their friends. One reason that we hold the craft activities in the church building with everyone else is so that the children

never feel separated from their parents, and vice versa, resulting in a feeling of everyone worshipping together. It also resolves some other issues of having enough supervisors who are Childsafe accredited, which would be necessary if the children were taken away from their parent's vision.

To enable these craft activities to occur we enjoy the help of some of the parents to watch over the little ones, especially those learning to use scissors and glue safely. If your child is quite competent at these activities, feel free to leave them at the table with the others whilst you enjoy some listening time yourself. (The helpers do glance around and help most of the children, but we cannot guarantee them all one on one attention for the whole activity. ) We are grateful to several ladies and older children in our fellowship who prepare the craft activities for the enrichment of the little one's worship time. Thank you.

Similarly, we are grateful to the donors of money and craft goodies that we use. (If you have any left over craft materials that you think could be utilised, please leave at the front office. Thank you.)
