Pastor's Column

Today we shall be looking at the Gospel reading and in particular Mark 10:13-16 through the theme: Receive the kingdom of God.

We are also welcoming **Bianca Hackett** into our congregation through Holy Baptism. Welcome **Michelle & Nick** and all: family and friends who have joined us to celebrate this special occasion. Bianca's Support person is Mardi Kalika.

Wasn't **Servant September** wonderful? I hope you gained insights, received encouragement and were challenged throughout this month. TIME SUNDAY emphasized those special (*Kairos*) moments, reminded us that through forgiveness we have a new start, challenged our priorities and encouraged us to use such tools as diaries, lists...to do what is "important". On LCA SUNDAY we received a wonderful testimony from James Doecke on how God led him to take up being the Director of Lay Ministry; we gained insights in the day of an ALC student, the workings of the LLL (through Allen Kupke's children's

address) and received a succinct synod report. On TREASURES SUNDAY we explored the theme: *The giver God loves* by looking at Sister Mary Mackillop. We considered the importance of budgets and giving. It was on that day we launched our Day Pay Sunday. (See elsewhere in the Bulletin for that launch) TALENT SUNDAY reminded us that we all have gifts/talents and God expects us to use them but we use them *in his grace*: the grace of discovery, encouragement and opportunity. It was on that Sunday I stressed what a wonderful congregation we have which allows us to explore our gifts and develop them. The *Network Course* was also promoted. (*See below*) On each Sunday we also had the opportunity to rededicate ourselves to God. Thanks to the Worship Team, especially Brian Quick who prepared many of the powerpoint presentations and to the teams who prepared the visuals displays for each Sunday.

We are running a **Network Course** starting on Thursday 15th October. This course (which we successfully ran this time last year) is designed to help you discover your spiritual gifts, personal style and God-given passion for serving in the body of Christ. I hope you will join us. The course goes for 6 weeks (It finishes on 19th November.)

Don't forget about the **Global Leadership Summit** this Friday and Saturday (9th 10th October). At this Summit world leaders such as Bill Hybels, Jessica Jackley, David Gergen, Harvey Carey, Gary Hamel, Dave Gibbons, Wess Stafford, Bono, Tim Keller, Andrew Rugasira will give us insights into leadership and will challenges us to "lead where you are". These Summits are such an inspiration. And for us it only costs \$99. Talk to those who went last year or the year before.

We shall be **bidding farewell** to **Anna & Kevin Watson** next Sunday (11th October). We will be praying for Anna & Kevin and having a special morning tea after the service. *Please bring a plate of food for this morning tea*.

The Pastoral Carers are looking for people to be involved in the **Open Christmas Dinner: a Christmas lunch** in our Fellowship Room for people who don't have a family with whom to share Christmas. Marty Seidel launched this last Sunday. See him if you want to join the team or want to come along.

The One Year Bible. I haven't mentioned too much about this reading plan over the last few weeks. But just to remind you about 3 points:

- If you want to grow in your spiritual life one very basic way is through regularly studying your Bible. I suggest SOAP (Scripture, Observation, Application, Prayer).
- I believe it would be wonderful if we are all reading the same Bible plan. Then we can share insights when we meet and especially in the devotional time before each meeting.
- You don't have to read all the Bible passages listed in the reading plan. (If you do you will be reading the Bible in one year. But if you take either the Old Testament, New Testament, or Psalm and Proverbs you would be reading it in 3 years.)

KIDS AT HEART



For our visitors, the Kids at Heart team is a small team of people in our congregation who are keeping our children's needs at heart and remembering that the adults are sometimes kids at heart too. One of our ambitions is to let the kids have some fun at the quiet craft table during the sermon. That way, they have some time with their parents during the morning services, and also a little bit of time to be creative, to wriggle around and to learn about our God and what He means to us through artistic activities, with their friends. One reason that we hold the craft activities in the church building with everyone else is so that the children

never feel separated from their parents, and vice versa, resulting in a feeling of everyone worshipping together. It also resolves some other issues of having enough supervisors who are Childsafe accredited, which would be necessary if the children were taken away from their parent's vision.

To enable these craft activities to occur we enjoy the help of some of the parents to watch over the little ones, especially those learning to use scissors and glue safely. If your child is quite competent at these activities, feel free to leave them at the table with the others whilst you enjoy some listening time yourself. (The helpers do glance around and help most of the children, but we cannot guarantee them all one on one attention for the whole activity.) We are grateful to several ladies and older children in our fellowship who prepare the craft activities for the enrichment of the little one's worship time. Thank you.



Day's Pay Challenge

On Treasures Sunday (20/9/09) I launched our Day's Pay Challenge. In the launch I made these 7 points:

- It is a good habit to giving weekly to God (to tithe) as a constant way of saying thanks to God, like saying grace before a meal.
- But every so often we need to express our gratitude in a more substantial way and that is what Dav's Pay Challenge is all about.
- It is also a way for our congregation to get rid of our deficit so that we can do some things that we have been putting on hold.
- Simply, the Day's Pay Challenge is to give how much you earn in one day. One way of calculating this is by talking your annual salary (either gross or net) and dividing it by 200. Of course if your work is sporadic or part time or casual it is a bit more complicated. But the 200 rule on gross makes it simple. So if you earn \$30,000 a year, it would be \$150, \$50,000 it would be \$250, \$80,000 it would be \$400. If you get \$10 pocket money a week it would be \$2.50, if you are on the average wage for an Australian worker (of \$1166 a week) then it would be about \$230, if you are on a pension it would be about \$60.
- Please use the envelopes marked Servant September Day Pay Donation and place it in the offering plate by All Saints Day (1/11/09): in 5 week's time. If you want to do it through REG, just put a note in the envelope indicating this.
- One of our members in his generosity is going to match dollar for dollar up to \$10,000.
- This is your challenge. It is between you and Godan expression of thanks to God and it's a means to give a boost to our congregation.

General Synod – Luther College, Melbourne

The National Synod is being held (2-5 Oct) and I am the congregation's representative for the three year period until the next synod in 2012. The theme is 'Learning to walk again.' Our President of the Church Pastor Mike Semmler speaks in his report to Synod that "our walk is with the Lord. In our zest both to retain and reclaim more of our vibrancy as a Church of substance, we walk together as one Church, in Christ, nurturing, confessional, in mission; connecting and re-connecting with what gives us life." The theme of 'learning to walk again' presents a very real challenge to not only the church in general but to local church communities in Australia where we have to learn or re-learn to walk alongside people who increasingly see no need for God or who are searching for spirituality in all the wrong places. Pastor Mike suggests that we need to reconnect with the substance of the Word (and Pastor Rob Voigt also recently challenged us to improve our Biblical knowledge through regular Bible Study). Our challenge as a church is to allow the Spirit to use this reconnection to the Word to reach out to others with the Good News of Christ Jesus.

Please pray for Synod, for the leaders and the committees, for the decisions and directions, and pray for the Lutheran Church of Australia as we learn to walk again in Christ.
