

TWO MINUTES

The Rich and the Kingdom of God (Mark 10:17-31)

No doubt some of our readers will have seen the NOOMA DVD called simply 'Rich'. It's message, that we in the Western world are indeed rich. When we lived in PNG in the early 1980's there was one tribe whom we visited regularly. An anthropologist had worked with them over the years. He happened to be around on one of our visits. He told us that he estimated that the average income for these people was 4 Kina (\$2 Aust.) per year. If you saw some of their clothes you would be inclined to agree.

The Gospel: Compare the two people in Mark's story, Jesus and the young man who had great wealth. Jesus loved this young man we are told. He didn't love Jesus. He loved his wealth. Called to follow Jesus, he refused because of his wealth and went away sad. But Jesus who was rich, was willing for our sakes to become poor.

The O. T: Amos rebukes the rich in Israel for their mistreatment of the poor. He says they trample on the heads of the poor. He tells them to seek the Lord and live. We might say they need to get a life. He warns them of the Divine judgment which will destroy their luxury houses, both the winter one and the summer one. It did.

The Epistle: Hebrews teaches us that the word of God is judging the thoughts and attitudes of our hearts (including to wealth) and that everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account. Is our wealth making us as a nation, as individuals, sad? Will it lead to God's judgment on us?

Day's Pay Challenge

On Treasures Sunday (20/9/09) I launched our Day's Pay Challenge. In the launch I made these 7 points:

- It is a good habit to giving weekly to God (to tithe) as a constant way of saying thanks to God, like saying grace before a meal.
- But every so often we need to express our gratitude in a more substantial way and that is what Dav's Pay Challenge is all about.
- It is also a way for our congregation to get rid of our deficit so that we can do some things that we have been putting on hold.
- Simply, the Day's Pay Challenge is to give how much you earn in one day. One way of calculating this is by talking your annual salary (either gross or net) and dividing it by 200. Of course if your work is sporadic or part time or casual it is a bit more complicated. But the 200 rule on gross makes it simple. So if you earn \$30,000 a year, it would be \$150, \$50,000 it would be \$250, \$80,000 it would be \$400. If you get \$10 pocket money a week it would be \$2.50, if you are on the average wage for an Australian worker (of \$1166 a week) then it would be about \$230, if you are on a pension it would be about \$60.
- Please use the envelopes marked Servant September Day Pay Donation and place it in the offering plate by All Saints Day (1/11/09): in 5 week's time. If you want to do it through REG, just put a note in the envelope indicating this.
- One of our members in his generosity is going to . match dollar for dollar up to \$10,000.
- This is your challenge. It is between you and Godan expression of thanks to God and it's a means to give a boost to our congregation.
