

TWO MINUTES

I am so pleased to be given this opportunity to present the "Two Minutes" to remind you what this is all about. The thought behind the "Two Minutes" is to give the congregation something to read two minutes before we start our worship based on the readings of the day.

I am also pleased that many members of the congregation have taken up this challenge to share their insights with the rest of the congregation. Thank you for this. I really appreciate it. The original thought too was to fashion it in the same way that we have encouraged you to journal - using **SOAP: Scripture**: read the Scripture and allow God to "strike you" with a verse then record it: give a few points of **Observation** about it: context, elaborate on words used, what it's getting at...then give an **Application**: how it applies to your life and hopefully others, give the devotion a title and then finish with a short **Prayer**, and all of this in about 200-400 words, which should take about two minutes to read. (Of course if one chooses to follow a different approach we certainly accept that as well.) Pastor Leon

The answer is love—Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.'

Mark 12:30

A teacher of the law who had appreciated Jesus' debate over paying taxes and marriage, approached him with a pretty typical question for religious people to discuss (in their Bible study): What was the most important commandment?

He would have expected Jesus to cite one of the Ten or the many others that the religious leaders had introduced. This approach leads to legalism: trying to get right with God by keeping particular commandments. But instead Jesus summarized them, using the Scriptures (Deuteronomy 6:4,5 and Leviticus 19:18) to two: the answer is love: love God and love your neighbor: so simple and so freeing.

This the teacher heartily agreed with. It's not just in knowing the Scriptures but being able to apply them is important.

Jesus is taking up the Old Testament reading for today in quoting from Deuteronomy. (This is also from where this morning's Message: "You are a saint, now what?" is taken.)

It is so easy to slip into legalism: you should do this and don't do that. But the answer is to love.

That is the same answer Luther gave in his explanation to the commandments in the Small Catechism: "You should fear and love God that..."
We love in response to God's love for us. Of course we have to determine what love is in each situation. The Holy Spirit helps us to do this.
I believe one way to express love is to think what would be best for that person (even if it's not good for you). In regard to God it's to give him the glory.

I need this answer because I tend to slip into legalism. I need this safeguard to protect me and I need God's forgiveness (an expression of his love) when I do slip into legalism. I need this answer too, to free me because legalism enslaves me.

Prayer: Lord thank you for your love. Please protect me from legalism. Forgive me please when I have slipped into legalism. May my life be an expression of the love you have given back to you and to the people about me. Amen. **Pastor Leon**
