

TWO MINUTES

Have you ever tried to make a prediction? Here are some predictions from the past. All from famous people who were trusted individuals: Thomas Watson who was the chairman of IBM once said, "I think there is a world market for maybe five computers." An inventor named Lee DeForest once said the "While theoretically and technically television may be feasible, commercially and financially it is an impossibility". And finally Bill Gates the founder of Microsoft once said "640K ought to be enough for anybody".

The disciples when hearing Jesus say: "Do you see all these great buildings?" and that "Not one stone here will be left on another; every one will be thrown down.", must have thought that this was next to impossible, as the size of even the smallest stone in the temple weighed between two and three tons each. It's not hard to understand why the four disciples asked Jesus when the temple would be destroyed.

Unlike the predictions of Watson, DeForest, and Gates, Jesus' prediction came true. Around 70 years after Jesus' death, the temple was grounded by the Roman armies and not one stone was left on top of another. So what does the fulfilment of this prophetic word teach us? It teaches us that the foundation of faith in not in a temple made by human hands. It teaches us that the foundation of faith is not in signs and wonders. What it teaches us is that our foundation of faith is the Son, Jesus Christ who is our High Priest, our redeemer, and our God.

I am taking 9 days of my annual leave in the following days. **Amy** is getting married next Saturday to **Nick Schultz** whom many would have met. He is a regular worshipper at the morning services and member of GGAF.

In two week's time (29/11/09) we are holding our **Remembrance Sunday**. It is an opportunity to remember any loss that we are still grieving. Invite your friends who are grieving over a loss to be ministered to. More information next week.

I need to repeat a few issues that I noted in last week's Bulletin for those who haven't had an opportunity to catch up with the news:

The Vision Team in deliberating on our goal of "Care Communicate and Connect so people know Christ", determined it expedient that we improve our communication through the technology at our disposal especially to keep us in touch with non-regular attendees. (We have many efficient means to communicate such as emails, face book, SMS messages, blogs, through our web page as well as the standards: Bulletin, telephone, face to face, but many of us don't seem to know what is going on!) So we are proposing to have (for lack of a better term) a "communications officer" at GGLF: a volunteer position to improve our communications. That person would not need to be an expert in all the areas listed above but have an understanding of them and be able to coordinate a communication program for GGLF. Do you feel called to this position? If so see me.

Please take note of the Fellowship Group Leaders meeting advertised elsewhere in this Bulletin. **Talking about Fellowship Groups**, earlier in the year I indicated that I would like to visit every Fellowship Group in our congregation. I have visited all those who have invited me. *Are there any other groups who I haven't got around to?* Please let me know- in fact please invite me to your next meeting. I just want to be get a feel of each Fellowship Group. A thought from a recent Ministry team meeting: if any groups would like me to lead any studies I would be more than happy to do so.

From the Ministry Team: *The Gathering 2010*: proposed for February or March 2010. Theme: *Zone in to God*: enter into God's zone - his way of thinking, God's zone is safe and yet very dangerous - when we take being a disciple seriously so instead of zoning out tune into what God is saying to you, .We are planning for the tried and true schedule we have used in the past: worship, an input and discussion, morning tea, quiet time, debrief, communion and a BBQ lunch.
