Dressed to Love

Pastor's Column



On behalf of Heidi and myself, I wish you a blessed Christmas. May the joy, peace and love of Christmas fill you and overflow to the people around you!

I reckon that the message of Christmas came through so strongly through Elizabeth's meeting with Mary in the Gospel reading last Sunday (Luke 1:39-45). It is very much a *Christmas incident*: Christ coming to us and expressed so well through Elizabeth's "evangelism style" of teaching: teaching us that we are favoured, who the Lord really is and that we appropriate this by faith. If you are reading this on **Christmas Eve**, I pray that you will enjoy the drama: **Law** and order: **Bethlehem** and be inspired by it. It has been videoed and these are available on request.

As you may have noticed the emphasis isn't so much a program for younger children as we have had in the past. So on **Christmas Day** we are celebrating "A children's Christmas" featuring the skit: "Jesus Christmas party", a children's address: "Christmas: meet the cast", a story time, a short message, and lots of carols as well as Holy Communion.

If you are reading this on **Sunday** – the first Sunday of Christmas as it is traditionally called, we are celebrating **a carol service**: based on 9 of our most favourite carols. We will learn some of the history behind these carols and look at them a little more closely. Did you know that it is reported that Charles Wesley, the author of "Hark the herald angel's sing" never sang the carol because the words were changed from "Hark! How all the welkin rings, "Glory to the King of kings….'."?

Also this Sunday **David & Tania Nelson** will commissioned for their mission trip to Myanmar as well.

And we have **Michael Edgecomb** speaking to us at Salt Factory.

Next Thursday we are celebrating **New Year's Eve** with a Taize style worship service. I hope you remember this special service to see out the past year and welcome the new. Our ALC student James Leach will be leading this and I shall be preaching.

Going back to the thrust of the month: "Creating confidence to share your faith". We were given a couple of tools: "My personal mission field" and "My focused prayer list." a few weeks ago. How are you going in using these? Jeff Wegener has volunteered to help anyone who is struggling with these to assist them in drawing them up.

Sunday week (3/1/10) we are starting the next part of the series: "**Sharing your story**". Our story is the strongest evangelism tool God has given us. We'll be discovering how we can use it effectively, hearing a few stories (testimonies) which are both inspiration and instructive, and we'll be encouraged to develop and use our own story with those God is putting before us. I hope you can join us for this - I would say - *exciting* discovery.

Also Sunday week **Rhianna Bormann** (daughter of Stephen & Kim and grand daughter of Joy) is being baptized. What a great way to start the New Year!

I will be taking a week of **my annual leave** (4-11/1/10) in the New Year.

Each Sunday evening during January we have the opportunity to watch a DVD "Out of the Valley. Paul Swansson has organized this series, which takes the place of Salt Factory worship in January.

On **10th January 2010** the PNG Missionary Fellowship are celebrating their annual **Mission Festival/PNG Reunion** here at our morning service. The ex overseas missionaries are running the service, our Pastor Len is leading the worship and Dr. Dean Zweck is preaching. 
