1. TEACHERS INSTALLATION

Asaroka Lutheran Secondary School has 65 teachers including the Principal and 3 deputies. The 65 teachers were installed on the 31 of May 2017.

Church leaders from the ELC -PNG Goroka district conducted the installation. Reverend Graham Baitol, Pastor of St. Johns shared a very inspiriting and challenging message. A mumuwas organized by the school to which everyone enjoyed.

2. NEW SCHOOL BUS

A new 16 seater bus has been added to the fleet of vehicles. The Principal, Mr. Peter Hasu announced that it was time the school had a bus to transport day teachers. Mr. Hasu said that the bus was bought over the holiday periods and it was ready for 2017 school year. The bus was dedicated by the school Chaplain.

Day teachers have expressed gratitude that the school bus is now doing a fine job picking up and dropping off teachers. It is a relief, as one had to struggle with the large student and public population to go home or come to school catching the PMV buses.

3. COMPUTERS & OTHER GIFTS FROM ADELAIDE

Asaroka is a very lucky school! Our partners from Golden Grove in Adelaide, Australia sent us a large container packed with goods. Computers, library books, projectors, practical skills power tools, Sunday school books and many more stuff were sent!

This partnership had existed for many years. Pastor Len Tscharke (who started the school and the mission here) and his sons and other Christians visit some times each year and do help. We have not been able to





thank them enough for their help in times of need but these help have been a great rays of sunshine to us. The happiness we feel is a great blessings we believe they receive in reverse. May God greatly bless them.

4. SPEAKERS FOR REACHOUT

The Reach Out and congregation of the Asaroka Lutheran Secondary school have been blessed with 2 new Peavey speakers, microphones and other peripherals. Keyboard from Adelaide is a blessing toward this. The Chaplain thanked the school administration on behalf of the congregation and Reach -Out for looking at the need and stepping in.

5. EASTER CAMP IN LAE

The annual Easter camp for this year will be held in Gabmazung, Markham. Over 90 students and teachers are ready to go. Mr. Peter Hasu (Principal) has said that the school will assist with transport down and back. The camp fee



should be met by each participant.

Participants from all Highlands schools as well as Momase are expected to attend, as is the tradition. The Easter camp begins on Thursday evening and ends on Sunday evening. Enjoy Easter those of you who go and celebrate man's liberation from sin and bondage by the Child who was born, died and rose again.

6. RINTEBE VS ASAROKA

Asaroka and Rintebe have a special sister schools relationship. Every year sports are organized between these two schools where teachers play games. Recently we went to Rintebe and we were welcomed. A big feast was organized for us and we were treated like kings and queens. Thank your Rintebe.

Asaroka will invite them next term (term 2). It is a time we enjoy very much and come to know each other.



7. CHALLENGES

We have mentioned lots of blessings. It is man's tendency to always want to enjoy good things and not bad circumstances. But such bad situations make us to learn and grow.

We have had our challenges too. Typhoid has begun to hit some students. But health authorities have stepped in quickly and the sickness is under control.

We also had students who passed away last year. Parents of teachers have also died. When this happens we assist in little ways we could.

There have also been other issues regarding the Principal position but that has died and the school is running normal.


